A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

**W**HEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday the thirteenth day of January one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, then to assemble and be holden for the despatch of divers urgent and important affairs, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby issue Our Royal Proclamation, and publish and declare that the said Parliament be further prorogued to Thursday the twenty-seventh day of January one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and the Lords, Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are discharged from their meeting and attendance on the said Thursday the thirteenth day of January one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven; and We do hereby further, with the advice aforesaid, declare Our Royal will and pleasure that the said Parliament shall, on the said Thursday the twenty-seventh day of January one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, assemble and be holden for the despatch of divers urgent and important affairs; and the Lords, Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said Thursday the twenty-seventh day of January one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

Given at Our Court at Osborne House, Isle of Wight, this thirty-first day of December, in the year of Our Lord, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and in the fiftieth year of Our Reign.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN.

At the Court at Osborne House, Isle of Wight, the 31st day of December 1886.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

It is this day ordered by Her Majesty in Council that the Convocations of the Provinces of Canterbury and York be prorogued from the day to which the same now stand prorogued, to Friday the twenty-eighth day of January one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven; and then Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor of that part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain is to cause Writs to be prepared and issued in the usual manner for proroguing the Convocations accordingly.

The Queen has been pleased to give and grant unto Edward Divers, Esq., M.D., F.R.S., Principal and Professor of Chemistry at the Imperial College of Engineering, Tokyo, Her Majesty's Royal licence and authority that he may accept and wear the Insignia of the Order of the Rising Sun of the Third Class, which His Majesty the
