

through, or intend to take up their residence in the country, must be in possession of a passport which has been viséd at the German Embassy at Paris. The visa must not be older than one year.

‘License cards for foreign commercial travellers do not take the place of the requisite passport.’

‘Foreigners who are not in possession of a regular passport are not to be allowed to proceed on their journeys, and if necessary are to be re-conducted across the frontier.’
