The Lords of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy-Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Proclamation of the 15th of May last, "For giving Encouragement to Seamen and able bodied Landmen to enter themselves on board His Ma-" jefty's Ships of War; for granting Rewards for discovering such Seamen as shall conceal them felves; for pardoning such Seamen as have deferted and shall return into the Service; and also for "taking up all stragling Seamen," hath been pro-longed and extended to the 21st of this Instant June: - And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the same should be continued for some Time longer; - It is therefore hereby ordered in Council, that the said Time be prolonged and extended from the aforesaid 21st Day of this Instant June, to the 31st Day of July next; and that the Bounties and Rewards given and granted by His Majesty's aforementioned Proclamation, be continued to be paid until the faid 31st Day of July next. — Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.
