*Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that, on Saturday last the 5th Instant, was found, under the Gateway of the House of Mr. Andrew Sellon, in Mint Lane, near the High Street, in the City of Exeter, Merchant, the following threatening Letter; directed,*

“ For Andrew Sellon  
Exon ..

“ Sir

“ You may take this as a favour, in giving you warning of approaching damage to you which is already contriv'd and fit for execution directly if you do not forthwith fulfil the following Request at the time and place propos'd.

“ Betwen the hours, ten and eleven this Night following you are to put the Sum of thirty Guineas wrapt together, in a little pit made for that purpose close by the Side of the Bond Stone in the Great Schilly and you will find there a turf already cut fit to cover the Cash so close as tho' it was all Solid ground observe to put it that Side of the Stone that is white

“ You have had a caution not to omit the performance of this demand on any pretence whatever and now insist on a farther Submission and Secresy in the whole transaction of this affair, you are to let no person living know the Consequence of these lines. But yourself only and if you presume to put or place any person or persons or to tarry there or thereabouts yourself to watch the place after you have laid the Cash you must expect nothing but present Destruction, both to yourself and them that shall endeavour to assist you, and you may depend on such a Blow, as was never Known or ever invented against any man living if you do not Perform it as above directed by them who has it in their power to do as they please either for you or against you

“ Saturday Night is the Night to lodge  
“ the money for them as wish you well

*His Majesty, for the discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in Writing the said threatening Letter, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually wrote the said threatening Letter) who shall discover his or her Accomplice, or Accomplices, therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.*

*And, as a further Encouragement for the discovering and bringing to Justice such Offender or Offenders, the said Andrew Sellon does hereby promise a Reward of Fifty Pounds, to any Person or Persons making such Discovery as aforesaid, (except the Person who actually wrote the said threatening Letter) to be paid upon the Conviction of any one, or more, of the Offenders.*

*Whereas an Act passed last Session of Parliament, to enable the Lord Lieutenant of those Counties, where the Militia Forces have not been raised, to summon a Meeting of all such Persons as are qualified and willing to serve as Officers in the Militia, notwithstanding the Suspension made in Pursuance of the Directions of the former Acts: And whereas at the Meeting of His Majesty's Lieutenant, and Deputy Lieutenants of the County of Salop, this Day held at the Talbot Inn in this Town, a sufficient Number of Gentlemen qualified to serve as Officers in the Militia for the said County, did not appear, nor give in their Names in Writing for that Purpose: In order therefore that the Militia Acts may the more effectually be carried into Execution, His Majesty's said Lieutenant doth hereby give Notice, that another Meeting will be held at the Place aforesaid, on Tuesday the 22d Day of July next: And likewise desires that all Persons qualified to serve as Officers in the Militia for the said County, and willing to accept Commissions, will attend the said Meeting, or deliver, or cause to be deliver'd, their Names in Writing to His Majesty's said Lieutenant, or such Person as shall be appointed to receive the same, specifying the Rank in which they are willing to serve.*
