The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this Day read at the W BOARD, an Extract of a Letter from His Ma-jefty's Envoy at the Court of Turin, to the Right Honourable William Pitt, Efq: one of His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State, dated the Eighteenth of June laft, reprefenting, That he had juft received Advice of a Veffel being arrived at Marfeilles from Soria, with the Plague on Board : That upon open-ing the Hatches, three Perfors dropped down dead ing the Hatches, three Perfons dropped down dead, and feveral others were taken very ill, and that three other Veffels failed in Company with the abovementioned one from the Levant ; but as they have not been heard of for fome Time, it is apprehended their Crews are all dead .--And whereas a Quarantine of Forty Days is at this Time fubfilting upon all Ships and Veffels coming from or through the Mediterranean ;-- His Majeffy in Council doth therefore hereby Order, That the faid Quarantine be duly and punctually complied with : And that the Officers, appointed for the Service of Quarantine, do use their utmost Care and Diligence in caufing the feveral Rules and Regulations established for the due Performance thereof, to be firiely pursued and carried into Execution. -- Whereof the faid Officers, and all others whom it may concern, are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Proclamation of the 15th of May laft, "For " giving Encouragement to Seamen and able bodied Landmen to enter themfelves on board His Ma-" jefty's Ships of War ; for granting Rewards for " discovering such Seamen as shall conceal them-" felves; for pardoning fuch Seamen as have defert ed and shall return into the Service; and also for " taking up all firagling Seamen," hath been pro-longed and extended to the z1ft of this Inftant June; — And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the fame should be continued for fome Time longer; — It is therefore hereby ordered in Council, that the faid Time be prolonged and extended from the aforefaid 21ft Day of this Inftant June, to the 31ft Day of July next; and that the Bounties and Rewards given and granted by His Majesty's aforementioned Proclamation, be continued to be paid until the faid 31st Day of July next. --- Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

Whitehall, July 12, 1760. Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that, on Saturday last the 5th Instant, was found, under the Gateway of the House of Mr. Andrew Sellon, in Mint Lane, near the High Street, in the City of Exeter, Merchant, the following threatning Letter; directed,

" For Andrew Sellon Exon

" Sir

"You may, take this as a favour, in geving you "warning of approaching damage to you which is "already contrivid and fit for execution directly if "you do not forthwith fulfil the following Request at the time and place propose'd. "Betwen the hours, ten and eleven this Night

" following you are to put the Sum of thirty "Guineas wrapt together, in a little pit made for " that purpole close by the Side of the Bond Stone in the Great Schilly and you will find there a turf already cut fit to cover the Cash So close as tho' it was all Solid ground observe to put it that Side of the Stone that is white

" You have had a caution not to omit the per-" formance of this demand on any pretence whatever and now infift on a farther Submittion and Secresy " in the whole transaction of this affair, you are to let no perfon living know the Confequence of these lines. But yourself only and if you prefume to put or place any perfon or perfons or to tarry there or there abouts yourself to watch the place after you have laid the Cash you must expect nothing but present Destruction, both to yourself and them that shall endeavour to affist you, and you may depend on fuch a Blow, as was never Known or ever invented against any man living " if you do not Perform it as above directed by " them who has it in their power to do as they please either for you or against you "Saturday Night is the Night to lodge
