**I**N Consequence of the Disagreements which the Portuguese Minister had published between this Court and that of Lisbon, the Subjects of Portugal are preparing to leave this City. M. Almada, the Portuguese Minister set out from hence on the 2d Instant, having first dispatched a Courier to his Court with Notice thereof, and distributed to the Foreign Ministers a Manifesto containing the Motives of his Court for coming to an open Rupture with the Court of Rome. On the 5th arrived in this City from Switzerland, where they were arrested, the Persons who some Time ago robbed the Charitable Corporation of this City.
