N Confequence of the Difagreements which the Portuguese Minister had published between this Court and that of Lilbon, the Subjects of Portugal are preparing to leave this City. M. Almada, the Portuguele Minister fet out from hence on the 2d Instant, having first dispatched a Courier to his Court with Notice thereof, and distributed to the Foreign Ministers a Manifelto containing the Motives of his Court for coming to an open Rup-ture with the Court of Rome.
