E have received Letters To-Day, which inform us, that Marshal Broglio had, in the Night of the 12th, quitted his Camp at Immenhausen, and had fallen back, with his Army, towards Caffel, where he was making Preparations to ftrengthen himfelf. Prince Xavier had likewife been recalled from the Neighbourhood of Gottingen, and had retired to Munden and Witzenhaufen. By Accounts from Prince Fer-dinand's Army of the 14th, it appears, That his Serene Highnefs was to pafs the Dymel that Day, with the Referve under the Command of the Marquefs of Granby; and it was expected, the whole Army would follow on the next Day, or the 16th. Army would follow on the next Day, of the toth. Major Bulow, who had been fent upon an Expedi-tion against the French on the Side of Marbourg, has, it is faid, been fuccessful in entering that Town, destroying the Ovens, Cloathing, Spare Arms, and other Stores of the French Army : That he took 8 Officers, and feveral Men Prisoners, with a great Number of Commission, and their Train; and made a great Booty; and that he pufhed Parties forward to Butzbach, and afterwards retreated to-

wards Frankenberg Our last Accounts from Glogau mention, that the King of Pruffia was encamped on the 8th between Striegau and Schweidnitz, as Marshal Daun was between the last mentioned Place and Hohen-Friedberg. and, according to Appearances, had laid afide, for the prefent, his Defign of befieging Schweidnitz ; and that the Ruffians were at Hernstadt, and pushed their Light Troops forward, from Time to Time, to the Oder; fo that they had not yet entered Poland.
