

Whitehall, November 25.

Admiralty-Office, November 24.

Rear Admiral Rodney, by Letter of the 21st Instant, gives an Account, that Captain Oury, of the *Accean*, gave Chase, on the 16th, to a French Privateer of Sixteen Guns, and near Two Hundred Men, and drove her on Shore between Cape Barheur and La Hogue. The Enemy threw their Guns and Carriages overboard during the Chase; and as it blew hard at N. E. and a great Sea, the Moment she struck, the Masts went over her Side, and the Sea made a Breach over her, and she was effectually destroyed.

Also, That having ordered three Cutters to scour the Coast towards Dieppe, and endeavour to destroy the large Fishery the Enemy carry on from that Place, they took four large Fishing Vessels of sixty Tons, each with twenty-four Men on board, and drove ashore thirty others.
