We the Lords Juffices of Ireland, in Obedience to His Majefty's Commands, do Publifh and Declare, That the faid Parliament be, and accordingly the faid Parliament is hereby Diffolved : And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgeffes of the Houle of Commons, are difcharged from their Meeting and Attendance on the faid Twenty-feventh Day of April next.
