## Naples, June 25.

Rom Sicily we hear, that the French having held a Rendezvous of their Forces at St. Stefano, without the Gates of Mefsina, and made a countenance as if they would attack the Scaletta, had on the fudden difcovered their defign to be upon Melazzo, and were accordingly marched thither, and had already blocked up the place on the Land-fide, and at the fame time befieged it by Water with eight Gallies; That the Viceroy of Sicily, who happened to be there, was retreated with his Forces, fufficient to maintaim it into the Caffle. Upon this advice, our Viceroy has ordered fix Gallies to be put forthwith into a poflure to fail to Palermo, to join with 15 Gallies more that are there, and fo go together to the relief of Me-Lezzo.

Lezgo. Vienna, July 7. On Monday last the Count of Lamberg took possession of his place of Great Master of the Emperors Houshold, and was thereupon accordingly complemented by all the Persons of Quality about Court. The Sieur Pieger having compleated the new Regiment he raised, is marched with it towards Siless to join the other Imperial Troops there, under the command of General Cops. The Emperor has given Commission to the Count of Kauniz to raise for thwith a Regiment of Horse.

Hamburg, July 16. From Rensburg in Holftein we receive the confirmation of the Dukes having fubmitted to the demands of the King of Denmark, mentioned in out last. And our Letters add, That the King had put part of his Troops into quarters, in Holftein, and purposed himself to return to Copenhagen, without making any mention of any rupture intended with the The Magistrates and Inhabitants of this City Suedes. cannot quit the apprehensions they have, that the King of Denmark will attempt fomething upon them; the Deputies they fent to the King having not as yet been able to obtain any favourable answer from his Majelty, and our feurs are encreased by the news we have of two Danish Men of War being come into the Elle, and that part of the Kings Army advances this way. The Elefor of Brandenburg having held a Rendezvous of his Army near Perleberg, and found it to confift in above 16000 Men, has caufed it to advance towards Wifmar \$ and from Luberk comes a report, that they have al-ready inveiled that City. The Suediffi Army is about Demmin in Pomerania, expecting there feveral confiderable recruirs from susden and other parts; It is fuid, That in-five or fix days the Imperialists under the Command of General Cops, will be some up with the Brandenburgs.

From the Imperial Camp at Renchen, July 11. The Imperial Army has its head-quarter here, the River Renclean dividing ours and the Enemies Camp. Our parties go out daily, and return with good fuccels. This even ing the Major General Harrant has brought in 150 Pri-Ioners and a good booty, having totally routed a French Regiment of Dragoons ; the faid Prisentest rell, us, that the French are very much incommoded for wint of Fos rage.

Treves, July 12. The 27 paft our Governor the Count de Vignory, understanding that the Sicur de Louvigny, who commands at prefent in the Province of Luxemburg, had for some design drawn our the Garison that was in Echternac on the Source, ho forthwith marched thither with 200 Horfe, as many Poot and fome Dragoons, and made himfelf Maller of the place without any difficulty, and having demolifhed it, and taken away what Arms he found there, returned hither again. The 28, the Mareschal de Crequi arrived with the Forces under his command in our Neighborhood j the next day he fent out a party with two pieces of Can+ non, who took the Caffle of Romefin, the Garifon furrendring upon diferention, and demokifhed it , the 30, the Count de Vignerylikewife possessed kimfelf of the Castle of Efche, and the day following of the Town and Calle of Willicke, the Garifons in neither making any reultance; our Governor demolished all the faid places, and hath brought hither what Artiliery, Ammunition or other military provision he found these. The fixth inflant, the Mareschal de Crequi marched with his Troops through this City, and having paffed the Sarre went and encamped at Tauerne, where he continued till this morning, when he decamped again, and is marched towards Alfaria, with intention to go and join Monfieur de Turenne. Yesterday went out from hence a party of 400 Horle, with orders to go and burn four great Villages on the fide of Bonne, who have omitted to pay their Contributions,

Strasburg, July 12. The Imperial Army under the command of General Montecuculi continues encamped from Renchantock to Lichtenaw, and from thence as far as Buhel at the foot of the Mountains, the head-quar's ter being at Renchen : On the other fide, the French had their quarters from Bifsheim to Alrenheim : The Imperialifis have fortified Renchenlock, as being a Poft of great importance for the fecurity of their Camp , and for that reason, Monsieur de Turenne endeavoured to disposses them of it, but the Troops that were com+ manded on that defign were repulsed, though they made: their attack with a great deal of vigor. The eight infant the Troops of the Citcles of Suabia and Franconia which affembledat Hailbron, and are faid to make up together between 3 and 4000 Men, joined the Imperial Army. And befides the 1500 Foor that are already: come to the affiftance of the French under the conductof the Chevalier du Bleffys; we have advice, that the Marelchal. de Crequi is coming with another reinforcement, and that he is at present not far from hence. Upon the advice Monfieur de Turenne received that 3000 Imperialifis had paffed the Rhine below Raffadt, with defign to give him a diversion on that fide, and to cut off the Provisions which come from Haguenan and those parts, he immediately caused two Regiments of Dragoons' to pals the Rhine yesterday over his Bridge at Altenheim ; who were followed the last night by 3000 more, with order
