IS Majesty came this Day to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes feated on the Throne with the den, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod; was fent with a Meffage from His Majefty to the House of Commons, commanding their At-tendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal assent to,

An Act to continue an AA made in the Sixth Year of the Reign of His late Majefy King George the Second,

intituled, An Act for the botter fecuring and encouraging the Trade of Mis Majofy's Sugar Colonies in America. An Act for extending an Act intituled, An Act to differentiate, for c limited Time, the Duties payable on Tallsw imported from Ireland, to Hogs Lard and Greafe.

An Act to enable His Majefly to make Leafes and Copics of Offices, Lands, and Hereditaments, Parcel of His Dutchy of Cornwall, or annexed to the Jame; and for other Purposes therein mentioned.

An AEt to indemnify Perfons, who have omitted to quelify themselves for Offices and Employments, and to indemnify Justices of the Peace, Deputy Lieutenants, Officers of the Militia, and others who have omitted to register or to deliver in their Qualifications within the Time limited by Law, and for giving further Time for thofe Purpofes.

An AA to amend an AA passed in the Eighteenth Year of the Reign of King George the Second, concerning the Qualification of Juffices of the Peace; and for other Purpoles therein mentioned.
