*Prince Ferdinand's Head Quarters at Schweinberg, March 15.* Our Army keeps its former Position, (with very little Alteration in the Cantonment of the Troops) between the Rivers Schwalme and Ohm. The Hereditary Prince having executed the different Services on which he had been employed, has drawn nearer the Army, and sent some Part of his Corps to Laubach.

My Lord Granby, on the 11th Instant, removed his Quarters into the Neighbourhood of Lohr, having left at Murgurg the Regiments that had taken Possession of the Town. And the Corps under General Hardenberg arrived on the 14th at Kirchayn.

We hear, that Marshal Broglie, having been joined by his Reinforcements from the Lower Rhine, moved forward on the 10th; and at present occupies, with his Van-Guard, Geissen, and the Country about it. His own Quarters were, the Day before Yesterday, at Friedberg; and he was expected Yesterday at Butzbach.
