**A** Few Days ago Cavalier Rezzonico, Nephew of the Pope, was chosen Procurator of St. Mark's by the Great Council.

*Hague, April 3.* We have no Letters from the Allied Army since those of the 20th past. In the mean Time, we have various Reports concerning the late Marches and Operations of the French Forces, some of which import, that Marshal Broglie was at Ziegenhayn the 25th; having raised the Siege of that Place, and had some Advantages over the Corps, employed in besieging it, upon their Retreat.

The Allies had begun to withdraw their Forces from before Cassel on the 27th; and Prince Ferdinand of Brunswick had his Head Quarters in the Neighbourhood of Fritzlär the 29th.

By Letters from Brunswick we are informed, that the Prisoners taken by M. Clofen, in the Affair of the 21st, were already released.

*Hague, April 4.* The Prince of Orange, who has been very ill for a Day or two, is better this Morning.
