The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

7HEREAS the Time limited by His Ma-W jefty's Order in Council of the 27th of October laft, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, expired upon the 29th Day of this Inftant April — And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Ser-vice, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some longerTime : His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, Require, Prohibit and Command, That no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever (except the Master General, Lieutenant General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance for His Majefly's Service) do, at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid 29th Day of this Instant April, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaltwife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Twenty Ninth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, entituled, "An Act to impower His Majesty to pro-" hibit the Exportation of Salt Petre, and to enforce " the Law for impowering His Majefty to prohibit " the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of " Arms and Ammunition ; and alfo to impower His " Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwife of Salt " Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammu-" nition." And the Lords Commiffioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, and His Majefty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

Extract of a Letter from Vice Admiral Saunders to Mr. Člevland, dated in Gibraltar Bay, April 6, 1761.

I have the Satisfaction to defire you will acquaint their Lordships, that His Majesty's Ship Is fell in with the Orislame, on the 1st Instant, off Cape Tres Forcas, and, after a Running Fight of fome Hours, took her; and they are now both arrived in this She had been 29 Days from Toulon, and Bay. one from Oran. The Particulars of her Lading are not yet known, as her Papers of that Sort are not yet found.

I am extremely forry to acquaint their Lordfhips, that altho' the His had only four Men killed, Capt. Wheeler is unfortunately one of that Number, who, with two others, (a Midshipman and Quarter Ma-fler) were killed by one Shot very foon after the Beginning of the Action. The Ifis had nine wound-ed, two of them badly. The Numbers killed and wounded in the Oriflame are not yet afcertained, but are supposed to be between Forty and Fifty.

They began to engage at Six in the Evening, and continued a Running-Fight till Half paft Ten; the Oriflame endeavouring to get to the North-ward of the Ifis, in order to get over to the Spa-nish Shore, to prevent which, Lieutenant Cunning-ham, (commanding Officer of the Ifis) found it neceffery to run on Board her, which he did, with no other Damage to either Ship, than the Lofs of one of his own Anchors, very foon after which the flruck. She had 40 Guns mounted, 26 of twelve Pounders, and 14 of Eighteen, and upwards of 370 Men. As Lieutenant Cuningham (and all the Officers,

and People) appears to have behaved extremely well in this Action, I cannot omit recommending him earnestly to their Lordships Favour; and, for the present, I have given him an Order to command the Oriflame, till their Lordships Pleasure be known, whether she shall be taken into His Majesty's Service. She fails remarkably well; has lately had a thorough Repair ; is well found in all Respects ; and carries her Ports extremely well, though now deep

There is just now come into the Bay, a French Polacre, bound from Merfailles to Martinique, taken a few Days fince by His Majefty's Ship Firm, about 25 Leagues to the Weftward of the Gut.
