The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 27th of October last, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, expired upon the 20th Day of this Instant April — And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some longerTime: His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, Require, Prohibit and Command, That no Person or Persons whatsoever (except the Master General, Lieutenant General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid 20th Day of this Instant April, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition; or ship or lade any Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coast-wise, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf sirst obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and suffering the respective Forseitures and Penalties inslicted by an Act passed in the Twenty Ninth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, entituled, "An Act to impower His Majesty to pro-" hibit the Exportation of Salt Petre, and to enforce " the Law for impowering His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of " Arms and Ammunition; and also to impower His " Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwife of Salt Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammu-nition." And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
