The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the 27th of October last, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coaftwife, Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, expired upon the 29th Day of this Inflant April - And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefly's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition fhould be continued for fome longer Time : His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, Require, Prohibit and Command, That no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever (except the Master General, Lieutenant General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid 29th Day of this Instant April, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coaftwife, any Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or thip or lade any Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaft-wife, without Leave or Permiffion in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfaitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Twenty Ninth Year of His late Majefty's Reign, entituled, "An Act to impower His Majefty to pro-" hibit the Exportation of Salt Petre, and to enforce " the Law for impowering His Majefty to prohibit " the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of " Arms and Ammunition ; and alfo to impower His \* Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwife of Salt " Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammu-" nition." And the Lords Commiffioners of His Majetty's Treafury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, and His Majefty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
