7 HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 27th of October laft, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coaftwife, Guntowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, expired upon the 29th Day of this Instant April -- And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Ser-vice, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition fhould be continued for fome longer Time : His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, Require, Prohibit and Command, That no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever (except the Master General, Lieutenant General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance for His Majefly's Service) do, at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the fail 29th Day of this Instant April, prefume to transpost into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpow-der, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or thip or lade any Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arras or Amil onition, on Board any Ship or Vefici, in order to Maniporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaftwife, without Leave or Permifion in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fusiering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act paffed in the Twenty Ninth Year of His late Majefty's Reign, entituled, "An A? to impower His Majefty to pro-"hibit the Expertation of Salt Petre, and to enforce " the Law for impowering His Majefty to provibit " the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms and Ammunition ; and alfo to impower His 44 " Majefty to reftrain the carrying Coaftwife of Sal: " Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammu-" nition." And the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Mafter General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
