All being under their Banners, Bath, with an Officer of Arms, repairs to the Great Master, and they conduct him, with the usual Reverences, to the Rails of the Altar, where taking off his Hat, and kneeling down, he makes his Offering of Gold and Silver; then rifing up, and putting on his Hat, he returns, with like Reverences, to his Stall.

The reft of the Knights and Proxies, feverally or with their Companions, were in like Manner con-ducted to the Altar, and, after making their Offer-

ing, returned to their Stalls. Divine Service being ended, the Knights put on their Hats, and Bath Summoned them under their Banners as before; and the Companions then Installed, attended by Bath and an Officer of Arms, were conducted to the Altar, as at the first Offering,
