Leipzig, June 5.

**H**IS Prussian Majesty continues still at Kuntzendorff, and nothing of any Sort has yet passed in Silesia.

Every Thing remains quiet in the Camp of Schlettau, and the Army of the Empire has not yet begun to move. Marshal Serbelloni has his Quarter at Stattelstein, and General Clefeld is at Hoff with a few Battalions. That Army is reported not to exceed 7 or 8000 Men, and to be ill provided with every Thing.

Wesel, June 8. We have received such Quantities of Forage, that our Magazines are larger than they were before the Accident that destroyed them. The Battering Train of Prince Soubize's Army is preparing, and the Cavalry are employed in twilling Hay; so in a very few Days every Thing will be ready to open the Campaign.

Liege, June 9. Our Cardinal Prince is a Candidate for the vacant Bishopricks of Munster, and of Hildesheim; the Pope having granted his Highness a Brief of Eligibility upon certain Conditions.

Hamburg, June 9. We have Letters here from the Camp of the Prussians at Greiffenberg, dated the 2d of this Month, which say, that the Russians had passed the Vistula: That one Column of them, said to consist of 20,000 Men, were marching from Thorn to Posen. That which had been posted near Marienweider was advanced to Mewa.

The Camp composed of 18,000 Men near Dirschau, was moving towards Conitz and Tuchel.

General Tottleben, with his Light Troops, formed a Kind of Line above Butow, towards Tempelbourg: The Left Wing was filing off towards Friedland; and the Remainder, with the Infantry, forming themselves near Stolpe.

The Designs of the Enemy were not yet known; but in the mean While the Prussians formed a Chain against them from Colberg towards Coerlin, along the Right Side of the River Perfante; and the Light Troops were posted at some Distance in their Front, to be ready for the opening of the Campaign.

Hague, June 9. We hear, that on the 9th Instant the Army of the Prince of Soubize was cantoned in such a Manner round Wesel, as to be able to march into Camp in the Space of Twelve Hours: That a Bridge of Boats was laid at Mulheim, another at Dusseldorff, and a Third at Wesel. On the 10th, the Corps, that was encamped near Wesel, crossed the Lippe, and placed their Vanguard at Galen. The same Day, the Corps, that had been at Dusseldorff, arrived in the Camp at Wesel. That which was encamped at Rees, was to march the 10th, and was to join the Army at Peddenbourg on the 11th. There is a prodigious Desertion among their Cavalry; several of them have been seen here with their Horses and Accoutrements.

Letters from Warsaw, of the 29th ult. say, that the Russians were actually advancing towards Silesia.
