THE two following Addresses having been transmitted to his Excellency the Earl of Halifax, Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, have by him been presented to His Majesty: Which Addresses His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

To the King's most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Nobility, Gentry, Clergy, and Freeholders of the King's County.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

WHE your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, truly sensible of the Happiness enjoyed by your People of this Kingdom, under the wise, gracious, and mild Government of your Royal Ancestors of the House of Hanover, are only consoled for the Loss of our late most Excellent King, by being firmly convinced, from the auspicious Dawn of your Majesty's Reign, that Posterity will have Reason to look on your Majesty's Government as the most glorious in the Annals of England.

We therefore beg Leave to congratulate your Majesty on your Accession to the Throne of these Realms; and to assure your Majesty, that we will, on all Occasions, at the Hazard of our Lives and Fortunes, support and defend the Honour and Dignity of your Majesty's Crown and Kingdoms; religiously confiding, that Providence, as a Blessing to these Nations, will long continue the Sway of the British Sceptre to your Majesty, and to your Posterity for ever.

And we, with great Humility, rely on your Majesty's Concurrence to such Law as may be thought expedient to limit the Duration of Parliaments, and on your Majesty's paternal Care and Concern for the Prosperity of your Kingdom of Ireland, whose Protestant Inhabitants in general, and those of the King's County in particular, glory in their Duty, Loyalty, and Affection to your Majesty and your illustrious House.

Most Gracious Sovereign,
