*Whitehall, August 4, 1761.*

**L**ATE last Night the Directors of the East India Company received Dispatches over Land, from the President and Council of Bombay, giving an Account of the Surrender of *Mihie* on the 10th Day of February last, with all its Dependencies, on the Coast of Malabar, by *M. Louet*, Commander in Chief of the French Garrison of that Place, to *Thomas Hodges, Esq;* Commander at *Tellicherry*, and to *Hector Munro, Esq;* Commander of the King's and Company's Troops on that Expedition.

*Dusseldorp, July 26.* Prince *Soubize's* Army, for Want of Provisions, has been obliged to retire to *Menden* on the *Roer*, that he may be nearer his Magazines. *M. de Voyer* has been detached with Twenty-six Battalions, and a proportionable Number of Squadrons, to keep open the Communication with this Town and *Cologne*.

*Cologne, July 27.* The French, to conceal the Loss they sustained in the late Battle, bring in their wounded Officers as well as Soldiers in the Night. However, we know the Number of the former brought into our Hospitals exceed Two Hundred; of the latter there are near Three Thousand.

*Hague, July 31.* Letters from the Army, of the 28th inst, say, that *M. de Soubize*, after having sent a great Reinforcement to *Marshal Broglio*, had passed the *Roer*, and was retired into the Mountains. *Marshal Broglio* had assembled all his Troops at *Paderborn*; and Prince *Ferdinand* was in full March after him. Colonel *Freytag* had destroyed 50 Boats laden with Ammunition and Corn, and burnt the French Magazines on the *Fuld*, and the *Werra*. He did not lose a single Man in that Expedition.

The last Letters from *Silesia* are of the 18th, when the *Austrians* and *Russians* had not been able to effectuate their Junction; and that Part of the *Prussian* Army, which was placed on the Right and Left of the *Oder*, near *Breslau*, continued to occupy the Posts assigned to them. The *Van-Guard* of the *Russian* Army was advanced as far as *Wartenberg*. The King of *Prussia* was at *Pultzen*.

The *Russian* Corps under *M. Romanzow*, designed to attack *Colberg*, had not begun its Operations the 12th of last Month. The *Swedes* were in Motion, and were said to have actually passed the *Peyne*. Every Thing was quiet in *Saxony*. Prince *Henry* kept his Position at *Schleittau*; and *Marshal Daun*, and the Army of the Empire, had not yet begun to move.
