T is this Day Ordered by their Lordships, That upon the Day of the Coronation no Rires whatever be made, either in, under, or near any Part of the Scaffolding erected, or to be erected, on Account of the faid Coronation, in Westminster Hall, the Abbey, or elsewhere, upon any Pretence whatsoever: And in Case there should be a Necessity for Persons to go under the Scaffolding with Lights, that they be obliged to make use of Lanthorns. And the Lord Great Chamberlain, the Earl Marshal, the Dean and Chapter of Westminster, and the Surveyor General of His Majesty's Works, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may respec-tively appertain. Duffeldorff, Aug. 10. Yesterday the Prince of Sonbize made another Detachment from his Army to reinsorce Marshal Broglio's: It consists of 14 Battal-Hons, viz. eight Royal Grenadiers, sour of Taliaru, one of the Queen, and one of Forest, and in four Squadrons of Thianges's Dragoons.

Brunswick, Aug. 11. The melancholy News ar-

rived here this Morning of the Death of Prince Henry of Brunswick, of the Wound he received the 20th of last Month. He died in the Night, between the 8th and 9th, at Ham; where he had been attended by the best Surgeons, both of the British and French Armies.

The Enemy has attempted to establish a Communication for the Subsistence of their Army, between Gottingen and Hoxter; but the first Convoy, consisting of 250 Waggons was taken the 6th, by a Detachment of Hunters of Col. Freytag's Corps, going towards the Weser. The Meal and Bread was difperfed and given to the Country People; and the Waggons and Horses sent back to their respective Villages. The Defertion is very great in the Enemy's Army, and the Want of Provisions of all Kinds, is affigned as the Reason of it. At Cassel it has been published, by Sound of Trumpet; that no one should speak of the Affair of the 16th past, under very severe

Hamburg, Aug. 11 The Advice of General Butterlin's Retreat towards Wartenberg, upon the Confines of Poland, is not confirmed, he remaining still at Namslau; but according to Advices received this Afternoon, his Proffian Majesty continued in the advantageous Post which he had taken at Neustadt, after dislodging General Drawkowitz from it.

The Russians attacked, the 2d Instant, a Prusfian Magazine between Weida and the Oder, but were repulsed with confiderable Loss.

Cologne, Aug. 11. Last Night the Bridge of Boats that were thrown over the River between this Place and Deutz, was broke up in great Hurry.

Forty Pieces of heavy Cannon were taken out of our Arienal, and planted on the Redoubts opposite to Deutz; and this Morning the French Commandant has ordered all the Vessels and Boats on the Right to be brought to the Left of the Rhine, to prevent the Allied Troops from passing the River

Prince Clement, Youngest Son of the King of Poland Elector of Saxony, is arrived here.

Liege, Aug. 14. The French Troops, that were cantooned in this Bishoprick in the Spring, then de-The French Troops, that were manded of the States the Rations that were necessary for their Subfiftance; but the Prince's Privy Council defired they would first consume the Magazines they had here, as they were in Danger of being spoilt, and they promised to replace them whenever it should be required. In consequence of that Engagement, the Prince of Soubize now demands Four Hundred Thoufand Rations, which distress us very much at this Time, as the Clergy have refused to continue the extraordinary Taxes, that were to answer the Expence

occasioned by this War.

Wesel, Aug. 14. Yesterday the Army under the
Prince of Soubize arrived between Dorsten and Halteren: The Head Quarters are at Marle. It was ne cessary to approach the Rhine to facilitate the Arrival of above 120 large Vessels, that were loaded with Forage and Provisions for the Use of the King's Troops, and which have lain for above a Month, watching a

favourable Occasion to proceed to Rees.

By these Accounts, we are informed, that Lieutenant General de Staniville had occupied his Camp at Kleinenberg, with a flying one at Driburg: That the Corps of Count Lusace, Closen, and Chabot, occupy three separate Camps at Merssen, Poinsen, and Niem. M. deVaux commands a Corps at Hoxter; and M. de Belzunce

Letters from Paris are full of the Resolutions of the Parliament of Paris against the Jesuits, depriving them of all their Privileges and Prerogatives.

By a Letter of the 12th, from Munifer, we learn, that the Hereditary Prince was gone from that Side to join the Grand Army; that General Kielmansegge remained with a Corps at Kauren to observe the Prince of Soubise, who was at Essen, and was expected to march to Wefel; having first sent off a se-cond Detachment to join Marshal Broglio.

Hague, Aug. 18. Since the Eleventh Instant, Prince Ferdinand had marched to Detmold and Bellen; which is upon a Line with Hoxter. General Luckner had passed the Weser with his Corps at Hamelen, where he was to join Col. Freytag, and to endeavour to dislodge the Enemy, from the Post they are fortifying on the right Bank of that River.

The Prince Soubize was on the 13th at Marle, between Dorsten and Halteren. It is faid, that he has fince crossed the Lippe at Rettinghausen; and between Dorsten and Halteren. that Generel Kielmansegge, whom the Herestitary

Prince had left with Part of his Corps, to oppose him, had thereupon thought it necessary to throw a

large Garrison into Munster.

Letters from Hamburgh of the 14th Instant, fay; that the Russian Fleet, consisting of 32 Sail of Ships, were seen the 2d Instant off Rugenwald, at about Six German Miles from Colberg; but that, on account of contraty Winds, they had only been able

as yet, to debark 500 Land Forces.

Letters from Silesia of the 6th say, that General Laudohn, not having succeeded in his Views of joining the Russians, had quitted his former Position, and marched towards Lower Silesia; and that the Russians too had left their Camp at Namslau, and advanced to Hunsfeldt near Breslau: Upon which his Prussian Majesty was gone with his Army to Strehlen, where he continued when those Letters came away, and had from thence detached a Corps to cover the City of Breslau.

Admiralty Office, August 22. Extrast of a Letter from Sir Charles Saunders, Vice-Admiral of the Blue, to Mr. Clevland, dated in Gibraltar Mold, on board His Majesty's Ship the Neptune, July 20, 1761. It is with the greatest Pleasure that I defire you

will acquaint their Lordships, that Captain Proby, in the Thunderer, who was cruising off Cadiz with the Modeste, Thetis, and Favorite Sloop, in order to intercept the Achilles and Bouffon, has fallen in with and taken those Ships, and brought them into

this Bay.

On looking into Cadiz on Thursday Morning, the 14th Inslant, he missed the French Ships, and, at Two in the Afternoon of the 16th, he discovered them, Cadiz then bearing E. N. E. 4 E. distant 9 Leagues: About One in the Morning, of the 17th, the Thunderer came up with and began to engage the Achilles, who struck after an Action of about half an Hour, Cadiz then bearing E. 2 S. distant

The Thetis came up with the Bouffon about Seven the fame Morning: They engaged also about half an Hour, when the Modeste coming up, and

firing fome Guas, the Bouffon struck.

The Thunderer is pretty much damaged in her Masts, Yards, Sails, and Rigging, had 17 Men killed in Action, and 113 wounded, 17 of which are fince dead.

The Thetis had also suffered in her Masts, Rig ging, &c. but had not one Man killed or wounded.

I cannot yet afcertain the Loss of the Enemy; we are fending their Wounded to the Hospitals, of which I will fend a more particular Account as soon

as possible,

The Second and Third Lieutenants of the Thunderer are among the Wounded, and the former of them is in a very dangerous Way. Captain Proby also received a slight Wound in his Right-Hand.
