Magdebourg, August 15. HE latest Letters from Silesia mention, that the King of Prussia had his Head Quarters at Strehlen on the 8th: That a confiderable Body of Ruffians had got before Breflau, and had begun to throw fome Haubitzers into that Town, with an Intention to fet the Magazines on Fire, but that Lieutenant General Tausein, Commandant of Breslau, having been joined by a Body of Troops, which Major General Knoblock led to his Affistance, marched out of Breflau, and forced the Ruffians to retire from their Batteries, and to decamp from before the Place with a confiderable Lofs on their Side. General Czerni-chew, with the the Ruffian Van Guard, was then at Wohlau, and the Coffacks and Light Troops pafs the Oder, (which, by the Dryness of the Seafon, is at present very low) and ravage the Country on the Side of Jauer.

The Ruffian Fleet, confifting of Thirty-one Sail, has, fince the 3d of August, been employed in debarking the Artillerv and Troops at Rugenwalde; but to the 11th Instant that Fleet had not appeared in Force before Colberg. General Romanzow was then preparing to begin his Operations against that Fortrefs. In Saxony the Ruffian and Auftrian Armies continue to remain in their respective Positions, without any Alteration.

We have received here Brunfwick, August 18. the following Account of the late Successes of General Luckner and Colonel Freytag against the Enemy.

Mackenfen; August 15. General Luckner being arrived the 14th with his Corps on the Heights near General Luckner being Dassel, detached his Regiment towards the Enemy's Right Wing; and Colonel Freytag, with all the Light Horfe, towards their Left Wing, to take them directly in Flank. As foon as the Enemy perceived us, they drew back all their Forces from Daffel, and that Neighbourhood, towards the Foreit of Solling, and detached a large Body of Horse and Foot to the High Road that leads to Eimbeck. This Body was infantly attacked, and totally routed, by General Luckner's Huffars, and between 3 and 400 taken Prifoners, most of them Cuiraffiers : All that could not escape by Flight, were cut to Pieces. During this Transaction, General Luckner in

Perfon attacked in Front, with the Regular and Light Infantry, the Enemy, who were in Order of Battle. The Enemy, after having flood Luckner's Cannonading, and perceiving our Infantry advancing upon them in Front, retired in tolerable good Order towards the Foreft of Solling. In the mean Time, Colonel Freytag was engaged with the Light Horfe, and endeavoured to take the Enemy in the Rear, who did not think proper to wait for this Attack, but difperfed themfelves with great Rapidity in the Fo-relt, whither General Luckner is gone after them. Our Lofs is very fmall. The Brunfwick Chaffeurs have only 4 Men and 3 Horfes wounded, and none killed. Among the Priloners taken from the Enemy, are one Colonel, and two Majors. This Action was on the 14th. This Morning, the 15th, we hear a very brisk Firing towards Hoxter.

Some of the Runaways of the Enemy paffing through a fmall Village of the County of Hilde-fheim, called Alfeldt, where were fome of the Hunters Baggage, plundered and carried off Part of it.

Schoningen, August 16. On the 15th, at Eight o'Clock, the Brunswick Hunters marched. General Luckner's Corps rendezvoused about Dassel. Capt. de Campen was sent to observe Hoxter. Our March

was towards Uflar, where we arrived at Four. As foon as our Huffars and Hunters shewed themselves on the Rifing Ground near Wohle, and were turning about to attack the Enemy, they retreated by Allershagen to the High Mountain called the Sonnenberg, which is the Post they intended to have taken before our Arrival. The Heavy Horfe could not advance fast enough to overtake the Enemy. Some Cannon arrived, and when they began to play, we foot diflodged the Enemy from this advantageous Poft. They retreated with fo great Precipitation, that the Light Horfe were not able to get up with them. However, they purfued the Enemy in fuch a Manner, that they were forced to retreat into the Solling on a full Gallop. Lieutenant Colonel de Stockhaufen had before posted himfelf in the Solling with his Hunters and Cannon, having entered it by a Detour. He attacked the Enemy's Infantry, which was purfued by the Brunfwick Huffars, and defeated. We have taken two Pair of Colours of the Regiment of Jenner. Befides which, we have above 30 Officers Priloners, and upwards of 400 Men. We have also taken from them 400 Horfes.

The Brunswick Hullars have taken, 1 Brigadier, Jenner, 11 Captains, 22 Subaltern Officers, and 250 Soldiers, Swifs, Dragoons, and Huffars, with 1 Pair of Colours, besides 65 Horses.

Night coming on, put an End to the Fight.

It is not certainly known which Way M. Belfunce

has made his Retreat with the Remains of his Corps. Hague, August 21. We hear that all the French Hague, August 21. We hear that all the French Household Troops have repassed the Rhine, and are actually cantoned upon the Left Bank of that River, and in the Dutchy of Cleves ; and that they have fuffered very much from Want and Sicknefs. The Prince of Soubize, with the Remainder of his Army, was encamped between Dulmen and Applebaum, and General Kielmanfegge with his Corps near Munster.

Letters of the 17th Inflant, from the Allied Army at Reilenkirchen, take Notice, that Marshal Broglio had endeavoured to gain that Camp, but had been prevented by Prince Ferdinand, and obliged to take Post much farther back upon the Heights of Neim, opposite to those which were occupied by his Se-rene Highness. We have also an Account, that General Luckner had taken Prifoners, on the Right, of the Wefer, the fecond Battalion of Jenner's Regiment of Swifs, with their Officers and Colours.

Admiralty Office, August 25. His Majesty's Ship the Aquilon, commanded by Captain Chaloner Ogle, being on a Cruize, fell in the 7th Instant, 250 Leagues to the Westward of Cape Finisterre, with the Subtile, a French Frigate belonging to the East India Company, of 16 Guns, and 84. Men, from Isle Maurice, which he took, and has brought her into Plymouth.
