Wefel, August 18.

HE Army under the Command of the Prince of Soubizé is advanced to Appenhulfe near Muniter. The Hereditary Prince of Bruniwick has left a Body of about 12,000 Hanoverians, under the Command of General Kielmanlegge, to cover Munfter, and is marched, with the reft of his Army, to join Prince Ferdinand at Neuhaus.

We have fent hence every Thing neceffary for building our Ovens at Dorften; and there are feventy-eight Pieces of heavy Cannon, with every Thing requisite for undertaking a Siege, ready to march on the first Order.

The King's Household, being fickly, arrived here Yesterday, where their General Officers and Chiefs are lodged; the rest camp on the Left of the Rhine, near Burick. To-day the Gendarmerie decamp to canton at Cleves, and in that Neighbourhood.

The Head Quarters of the King's Household will be at Xanten on the Rhine, and in the Dutchy of Cleves.

The Horfe Grenadier Guards flay at the Army, with a Detachment of 300 Men drawn from the different Corps of the Houlehold, and 200 of the Gendarmerie.

Liege, August 21. Last Tuesday 17,000 Sacks of Flour arrived here from Givet, &c. They have all been unloaded, and deposited in the Cloisters of our Convents, till such simes as they can be forwarded with Safety to Wefel.

Magdeburg, August 18. It is reported that the King of Profia had removed his uarters from Strenlen to Kottenblutt; that the Ruffian Army had paffed the Oder at St. dt Leubus and Diebau; that Marthal Butterlin's Head Quarters were at Hydau near Parchwitz; that General Czernichew, with the Ruffian Van Guard, was at Wahltadt; and that Lignitz. Jauer, Strigao, and Hohenfrieuberg, were occupied by the Austrians. If thefe Accounts are but nearly due, an Action muft foon entue, which may probably decide the Fate of this Campaign. In Saxony the different Armies remain in the fame Inactivny.

Magdeburg, August 22. Letters from Glogau dated the 18th, bring an Account, that General Laudohn having on the 15th detached 43 Squadrons of Aufitian Cavalry, to join the Rullians who had paffed the Oder, and were encamped in the Neighbourhood of Parchwitz, his Pruffian Majefty meeting with that Body, on their March, had attacked, and entirely defeated them, made a great Number of Prifoners, and difperfed the reft.

foners, and difperfed the reft. Branfwick, August 21. This Evening the Corpf. of Prince Henry will enter this City, and be received at the Gate by their Serene Highness the Duke of Brunswick, and the Landgrave of Hesse, accompanied by all the General and other Military Officers, who will walk in Procession to the Cathedral Church, where the Body of His Serene Highness will be interred with all Military Honours.

The Advices from the Side of the Wefer mention, retreated immediathat Marihal Broglio having passed the Wefer at the Oder, canno Hoxter, the 19th, the Pofts of General Luckner and 17th Inflant. had, upon that, been withdrawn towards Eimbeck.

Prince Ferdinand had detached likewife a Corrs over that River, under the Command of General Wutgenau, who is now pofted at Halle, on the Road to Hamelen. Colonel Freytag, with his Chaffeurs, will take Poft, as is faid, on the Werra, to annoy the Enemy's Communication on that Side.

The Lofs of the French, in Prifoners, in the Actions which they had on the 14th and 15th Inftant with General Luckner at Daffel and Uflar, amount² ed to 44 Officers, and 759 Soldiers; befides which, they had 800 Horfes taken.

Stade, August 22. This Day Her Most Serene Highness the Princess Charlotte of Mecklenburg arrived here in perfect Health.

Hague, August 27. Letters from Paderborn of the 22d Instant inform us, that Marshal Broglio had received another Reinforcement from Prince Soubife of 14 Battalions, and feveral Squadrons, and that he had croffed the Wefer near Hoxter, which he had been before fortifying, but had now abandoned, and had taken the Road towards Eimbeck; and that the Head Quarters of the Allied Army were at Furstenau.

The Prince of Soubife continued in the Neighbourhood of Munster, and had begun to invest that Place,

Hague, August 28. The Head Quarters of Marshal Broglio were, on the 24th, at Moringen. His Army extended from that Place towards Eimbeck. Prince Xavier was at Dassel. The Light Troops of Prince Ferdinand's Army were gone into the Hartz.

The Prince of Soubize continues in the Neighbourhood of Munfter, and has fent a Detachment, under the Marquis de Voyer, to the Ems.

Letters from Dantzig of the 15th fay, that the Ruffian Fleet was again got together, and lay at Anchor near Rugenwalde in Pomerania, three or four Miles from Colberg, where they had landed the greateft Part if not the Whole of their Troops, who had already joined their other Forces in those Parts, and, would, as was supposed, foon form the Blockade of Collerg.

Hague, August 28. Letters just received from the Hague oring an Account, that on the 15th Instant, 43 Squadrons of Austrians, which had been fent by General Laudohn to join the Russian Army, were totally defeated by the King of Prussia; and that the Cannon and Trophies which the Horse Grenadiers had with them, were taken. That the Russian Army nad been driven back from Gross Backen to Mettiche, and that two Regiments of their Instantry had been made Prisoners by General Knoblauch, in the Purfuit towards the Oder.

Letters from other Parts make the Advantage on the Prufian Side flill greater, as they acquaint us, that the whole Body for Auftrians, defeated the 15th at ar Parchwitz, conflicted of Twelve Thouland Men, Part of which were the 43 Squadrons before-mentioned, who were the Prime of the Auftrian Cavalry and Horfe Grenadiers. They add, that the Ruffian main Army, upon the Report of this Defeat, having retreated immediately, the King purfued them over the Oder, cannonading them continually the 16th and 17th Inflant.

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
