The French Army marched the 4th to Holterhaufen, and passed the Lippe the 5th, on three Bridges, near Dorsten; and the same Evening the Army encamped at Westerboit.

Hague, Sept. 11. By Letters from the Army un-der the Command of Prince Ferdinand, we have an Account, that, his Serene Highness repassed the Dymel, and occupied pretty near the same Position which he possessed last Year, after the Affair of War-

Letters from the Lower Rhine confirm the taking of the Post of Dorsten, with the Battalion of Vierset in it. They add, that the Hereditary Prince had his Quarters, on the 6th, at Dulmen, and that he had

obliged the Prince of Soubise to pass the Lippe.

Letters from Magdeburg of the 5th, say, that, by the last Accounts from Silesia, which were of the 30th, his Prussian Majesty was still at Buntzelwitz: The Austrians liad quitted the Heights of Kuntzendorff, and had taken Post nearer to the Prussian Army; and at the same Time the Russians had made a Motion to their Left, in order to approach the From these Movements it was concluded, that they intended to attack his Prussian Majesty in his Intrenchments.

HEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased by His Royal Proplement by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty Second Day of July last, to promise and declare, (amongst other Things) That the Bounties of Five Pounds for every able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every ordinary Seaman should be paid to every fuch able and ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twelfth of this Instant, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board fuch Tenders as should be employed for raising Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And that a Bounty of Thirty Shillings should be paid to every able bodied Landman not above the Age of Thirty Five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the said Twelsth Day of this Instant, in like Manner voluntarily enter themfelves to ferve in His Majesty's Royal Navy; and that a Reward of Two Pounds for every able, and Thirty Shillings for every ordinary Seaman, should be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who should secret themselves, so that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's said Service. And whereas the Time limited for paying the said Bounties and Rewards is now near expiring: And it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the same should be continued for some longer Time; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly or-dered, that the Time limited by the faid Proclamation, for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards, be prolonged and extended from the faid Twelfth Day of this Instant September, to the Thirty-first Day of October next inclusive. Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.
