WHEREAS Our Parliament, which We summoned to meet at Westminster, on Tuesday the Nineteenth Day of May last, stands prorogued to Thursday the Eighth Day of October next; We, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall be further prorogued on the said Eighth Day of October next, to Tuesday the Third Day of November following: And We have given Order to Our Chancellor of Great Britain to prepare a Writt Patent under Our Great Seal for proroguing the same accordingly: And We do further hereby declare Our Pleasure, That the said Parliament shall, on the said Third Day of November, be held and sit for the Dispatch of diverse weighty and important Affairs. And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgeſſes, and the Commiſſioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are hereby required to give their Attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said Third Day of November.

Given at our Court at St. James's, the Twenty-fourth Day of September, 1761, in the First Year of Our Reign.

His Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to Order, That the Parliament which stands Prorogued to Thursday the Eighth of October next, should be further Prorogued to Tuesday the Third Day of November following. And that the Convocations of Canterbury and York, which stand Prorogued to Friday the Ninth of October next, should be further prorogued to Friday the 6th Day of November following.

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty Second Day of July last, to promise and declare, (amongst other Things) That the Bounties of Five Pounds for every able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every ordinary Seaman should be paid to every such able and ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twelfth of this Instant, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board such Tenders as should be employed for raising Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And that a Bounty of Thirty Shillings should be paid to every able bodied Landman not above the Age of Thirty Five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the said Twelfth Day of this Instant, in like Manner voluntarily enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy; and that a Reward of Two Pounds for every able, and Thirty Shillings for every ordinary Seaman, should be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who should secret themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's said Service. And whereas the Time limited for paying the said Bounties and Rewards is now near expiring: And it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the same should be continued for some longer Time; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited by the said Proclamation, for Payment of the said Bounties and Rewards, be prolonged and extended from the said Twelfth Day of this Instant September, to the Thirty-first Day of October next inclusive. Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.
