PROCLAMATION. GEORGE

IEREAS Our Parliament, which We fummoned to meet at Weftminfter, on Tuefday the Nineteenth Day of May laft, ftands prorogued to Thurfday the Eighth Day of October next; We, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publifh and de-clare, That the faid Parliament fhall be further prorogued on the faid Eighth Day of October next, to Tuefday the Third Day of November fol-lowing: And We have given Order to Our Chan cellor of Great Britain to prepare a Writt Patent under Our Great Seal for proroguing the fame ac. fummoned to meet at Westminster, on under Our Great binain to propage a the fame ac-cordingly: And We do further hereby declare Our Ple du c. That the laid Parliament fhall, on the faid This Day of November, be held and fit for the Difpatch of diverfe weighty and important Affairs. And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgeffes, and the Commiffioners for Shires and Burghs, of the Houfe of Com-mons, are hereby required to give their Attendance accordingly, at Weltminster, on the faid Third Day of November.

Given at our Court at St. James's, the Twentyfourth Day of September, 1761, in the First Year of Our Reign.

PRESENT,

The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

His Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to Order, That the Parliament which stands Prorogued to Trursday the Eighth of October next, should be further Prorogued to I usiday the Third Day of November following. And that the Convocations of Canterbury and York, which fland Prorogued to Friday the Ninth of October next, should be further prorogued to Friday the 6th Day of November fol-lowing.

AT the Court of St. James's, the 11th Day of

Shillings for every ordinary Seamon should be paid to every such able and ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fify, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who fhould, on or before the Twelfth of this Inflant, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefly's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieute-nants of His Majefty's Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board fuch Tenders as fhould be employed for raifing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And that a Bounty of Thirty Shillings should be paid to every able bodied Landman not above the Age of Thirty Five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the faid Twelfth Day of this Inftant, in like Manner voluntarily enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefly's Royal Navy; and that a Reward of Two Pounds for every able, and Thirty Shillings for every ordinary Seaman, fhould be paid to any Person who should discover any Sea-man or Seamen who should fecret themselves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for that luch Seaman or Seamen hourd be taken for His Majefty's faid Service. And whereas the Time limited for paying the faid Bounties and Rewards is now near expiring: And it being judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, that the fame fhould be continued for fome longer Fime; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly or-dered, that the Time limited by the faid Proclamation, for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards. be prolonged and extended from the faid Twelfth Day of this Inftant September, to the Thirty-firft Day of October next inclusive. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.
