Berlin, Sept. 22. By Letters received from M. Pluten's Corps at Czempin, we are informed, that fome Light Troops, whom he had pufhed forwards to Pofen, had fet Fire to the Ruflian Magazines at that Place. The Goneral was following the 17th with the reft of his Detachment, which confifted of 12 Battalions and 17 Squadrons, the Major Generals Knoblauch and Ziethen being with him. He was to be at Landsberg the 20th, and might reach Colberg, as was chought, by the 26th, where he was to endeavour to force the Ruffian General Romianzow manzow to raife the Siege of that Place. We hea from Silefia, that the Ruffian Army repaffed the Oder the 17th at Steynau, and directed their March towards Polen; that they were the 18th at Alt Girau; and the 19th at Schwesshau near Lissa.

Hague, Sept. 29. Our last Letters from the Country of Hesse mention, that Prince Ferdinand, with the Allied Army, was the 2ath in the Neighbour hood of Cassel, and the Hereditary Prince at Holtzdorff, four Leagues diftant f1om Marbourg. But we have as yet no Particulars of any Operations, that can be depended on. Upon the News of the Allies having repassed the Dymel, M. Broglio is faid to have quitted his Head Quarters at Eimbeck, and to have marched with his whole Force towards Caffel.
