AT the Court of St. James's, the 19th Day of October, 1761,

PRESENT,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majefty was graciously pleased by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty Second Day of July last, to promise and declare, (amongst other Things) That the Bounties of Five Pounds for every able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every ordinary Seaman, should be paid to every fuch able and ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who fhould, on or before the Twelfth Day of September laft, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieute-nants of His Majefty's Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board fuch Tenders as should be employed for raifing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And that a Bounty of Thirty Shillings fhould be paid to every able bodied Landman not above the Age of Thirty Five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who fhould, on or before the faid Twelfth Day of September, in like Manner voluntarily enter them-felves to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy; and that a Reward of Two Pounds for every able, and Thirty Shillings for every ordinary Seaman, should be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who fhould fecret themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen fhould be taken for His Majefty's faid Service. And whereas the Time limited for paying the faid Bounties and Rewards hath been extended to the Thirty Firft Day of this Infant October; And it being judged ex-pedient for His Majefty's Service, that the fame should be continued for fome longer Time; His Ma-jefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, as it is hereby accordingly or-dered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards, be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirty First Day of this Instant Oc-tober, to the Twelfth Day of December next inclu-Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take five. Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly

W HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the 30th of April laft, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coaftwife, Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the 29th Day of this Inflant October — And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition flould be continued for fome longerTime: His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, Require, Prohibit and Command, That no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever

(except the Master General, Lieutenant General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid 20th Day of this Instant October, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coast-wife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the refpective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act paffed in the Twenty Ninth Year of His late Majefty's Reign, entituled, "An Act to impower His Majefty to prohibit the Exportation of Salt Petre, and to enforce the Law for impowering His Majefly to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms and Ammunition ; and alfo to impower His Majefty to reftrain the carrying Coaffwife of Salt " Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammu-" nition." And the Lords Commiffioners of His Majetly's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, and His Majefty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
