A T the Council Chamber Whitehall, the 7th Day Shillings for every ordinary Seaman, fhould be paid to every fuch able and ordinary Seaman, not above

PRESENT,

The Lords of His Majefiy's most Honourable Privy Council.

HEREAS Information hath been given to the Lords of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, that a great Number of Journeymen, in the Cabinet and Chair Branches, have lately entered into a Combination to leffen the Hours of their daily Work, and to raife the Price of their Piece Work ; and that on Monday the 14th of September lait, at Nine of the Cock in the Morning, the Journeymen, in feveral of the Shops of the principal Cabinet and Chair-makers in London and Westminster, came in Bodies to their respective Masters, and demanded the Lessening their daily Hours of Work, and Raising the Prices of their Piece Work; which being refused, they immediately quitted their Services. That the faid Mafters have, by all Means, endeavoured to prevail on the faid Journeymen to return to their Bufinefs, and offered them Protection and Encourage-ment according to their Merit; notwithstanding which, they nold frequent Meetings at Publick Houses, and raise Subscriptions among themselves for supporting such Journeymen as are unemployed, and for carrying their Demands into Execution ; which, if complied with, would increase the Prices of Work, and greatly affect not only the Foreign Trade of those Commodities, but also those that are provided for Home Confumption. - And whereas it hath been forther represented, That the faid Journeymen Cabinet and Chair-makers, fo in Combination, deter and hinder others from working as ufual, and threaten them with Death or Maiming, if they do not come into, and affift them in their Demands-In order to put a Stop to fuch unlawful Combinations and riotous Proceedings-It is hereby Ordered in Council, That all and every His Majefty's Juffices of the Peace, Sheriffs, Under Sheriffs, and all other Civil Magistrates whatfoever, do cause the Laws against fuch Offenders to be immediately put into Execution, and use their utmost Endeavours to put an immediate Stop to fuch unlawful Meetings and Combinations; and that, in order to prevent the fame, they do particularly enquire into the Behaviour of all Mafters of Publick Houfes, where the faid Journeymen affemble and refort, in order to carry on their illegal Practices, to the End that fuch Profecutions may be carried on against them, as may be thought just and reasonable, to prevent this great Evil : And their Lordships do hereby Command the respective Justices of the Peace, and other Magistrates, that they do, from Time to Time, tranf-init an exact Account of what they shall do, pursuant to this their Lordships Order, to one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

THEREAS His Majefly was graciously pleafed by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty Second Day of July last, to promife and declare, (amongst other Things) That the Bounties of Five Pounds for every able Seaman, and of Thirty

the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twelsth Day of September laft, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board such Tenders as should be employed for raifing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And that a Bounty of Thirty Shillings should be paid to every able bodied Landman not above the Age of Thirty Five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the faid Twelfth Day of September, in like Manner voluntarily enter themfelves to ferve in His Majesty's Royal Navy ; and that a Reward of Two Pounds for every able, and Thirty Shillings for every ordinary Seaman, should be paid to any Perfon who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who should fecret themselves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majefty's faid Service. And whereas the Time limited for paying the faid Bounties and Rewards hath been extended to the Thirty First Day of this Instant October; And it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the same fhould be continued for fome longer Time; His Ma-jefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, as it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards, be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirty First Day of this Instant October, to the Twelfth Day of December next inclu-Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take five. Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly

7 HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the 30th of April last, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this Kingdo m, or carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder, Salt. Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the 29th. Day of this Instant October -And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefly's Ser-vice, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for fome longer Time : His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, Require, Prohibit and Command, That no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever (except the Master General, Lieutenant General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance for His Majefly's Service) do, at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid 29th Day of this Instant October, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coaftwile, any Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition. or fhip or lade any Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coast-wife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act paffed in the Twenty Ninth Year of His late Majsfty's Reign, entituled,
