And whereas the Time limited for paying the said Bounties and Rewards hath been extended to the Twelsth Day of this Instant December; And it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the same should be continued for some longer Time; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly or-dered, that the Time limited for Payment of the said Bounties and Rewards, be prolonged and extended from the faid Twelfth Day of this Instant December, to the Thirty First Day of January next inclu-Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.
