The French Squadron has never been at or near Ferrol. They are railing what Troops they can in Galitia, but at prefent have not more than 4000 Men qualtered near Ferrol, &c. As they imagine there are many English Ships detained in the Groyne, with their Rudders and Sails on Shore; but the Men have Leave to remain on Board, I have difpatched the Privater with this Intelligence, as the fails well, and hope the will arrive fafe.
