The French allow only Thirty Sols a Sack for transport-ing the Flour to Juliers, whereas it costs the States Seventy Sols a Sack; fo the States are obliged to lofe Forty Sols by every Sack the French pleafe to fend to their Army, which will finish the Ruin of the State, as we have already fuffered above Eight Millions of Florins, by the Forage we have been obliged to furnish; by the Passage of their Troops,

Hague, Feb. 26. We hear from Paris, that Mar-fhal Broglio, and his Brother the Count, have been banished to their Estates in the Country; and that the Former is deprived, at the fame Time, of his Command in Alface; and the Latter of the Govern. ment of Castel. It was not yet certain, to whom the Command of the French Forces in Germany would be given.

And as a farther Encouragement, the faid James Booth, does hereby promife a Reward of Fifty Pounds to any Person making such Discovery as aforefaid, (except as before excepted) to be paid by him upon the Conviction of one or more of the Offenders.
