A PROCLAMATION,

For giving Encouragement to Seamen and Able-bodied Landmen to enter themselves on Board His Majesty's Ships of War; and for granting Rewards for dif-covering fuch Seamen as shall conceal themselves.

GEORGE R. HEREAS for the fpeedy Manning Our Fleet, We did, by Our Royal Procla-mation bearing Date the 22d Day of July laft, Promife and Declare, amongst other Things, That the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fhould be paid to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who fhould, on or before the 12th Day of September then following, enter themfelves to ferve in Our Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of Our Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board such Tenders as should be employed for Raifing Men for the Service of Our Royal Navy; and that a Bounty of Thirty Shillings fhould be paid to every Able bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the faid 12th Day of September, in like Manner, voluntarily enter themfelves to ferve in Our Royal Navy; and that a Reward of Two Pounds for every Able, and Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fhould be paid to any Perfon, who should difcov r any Seaman or Seamen, who should fecret themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for Our faid Service : Which faid Bounties and Rewards have been continued by Our Orders in Council from the faid 12th Day of September to the 31st Day of lait Month. And whereas many Men are ftill wanting to compleat the Complements of Our Ships now fitting out for Sea, We do therefore hereby Promife and Declare, That, for the better Encouragement of all fuch Seamen, Seafaring Men, and Ablebodied Landmen who shall voluntarily enter themfelves into Our Service, the Bounties of Six Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Three Pounds for every Ordinary Seaman, be paid to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who shall, on or before the 31th Day of March next, voluntarily enter themfelves to ferve in Our Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of Our Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board fuch Tenders as shall be employed for Railing Men for the Service of Our Royal Navy ; And also that a Bounty of Thirty Shillings be paid to every Able-bodied Landman not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who shall, on or before the faid 31ft Day of March next, voluntarily enter themselves in like Manner to ferve in Our Royal Navy; And that fuch refpective Sums be paid to all fuch Seamen and Landmen immediately upon their Entring, by the Officers, employed in Raifing Men for Our

Fleet, with whom fuch Seamen and Landmen shall respectively enter. And we do further Promise and Declare, That a Reward of Five Pounds for every Able, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman shall be paid to any Person who shall discover any Seaman or Seamen who may fecret themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen shall be taken for Our faid Service on or before the faid 31ft Day of March next, by any of Our Sea Officers employed for raifing Men; the faid Rewards to be paid for any Seaman or Seamen fo difcovered and taken in and about London, by the Principal Officers and Commiffioners of our Navy; and at the Out Ports, by the Naval Officers where there are any, and where there are no Naval Officers, by the Col-lectors of Our Cuftoms, immediately upon a Certificate being produced to the faid Principal Officers and Commiffioners of Our Navy, Naval Officers, or Collectors of Our Cuftoms respectively, by the Perfon who may make Difcovery of any Seaman or Seamen as aforefaid, certifying his Name, and the Name or Names, and Number of Scamen procured in Confequence of his Difcovery; and the faid Certificate to be given by fuch Officer as may take fuch Seaman or Seamen for Our Service.

### GOD Save the KING.

The Thunderer, Anfon, and Lisbon, Feb. 20. Montague, arrived here the 11th Inftant, from Sir Charles Saunders's Squadron, to take in Provisions. The Arethufa Frigate, in her Way from Gibraltar, having loft her Main Maft, put into this Port to refit. Capt. Vane, who commands her, has taken two Prizes, one of which is fent to Gibraltar ; the other is the Guerrier, of 500 Tons, and 24 Guns, laden with Provisions, and bound from Bourdeaux to Martinico : She is come into this Port.

Signior Joseph de Sáa Perreira, who is appointed Minister Plenipotentiary from this Court to the States General, goes over with the Packet.
