A T the Court at St. James's, the 9th of April, ties of Six Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Three Pounds for every Ordinary Seaman, should

PRESENT,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the 19th of October laft, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the 29th Day of this Inftant April - And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition fhould be continued for fome longer Time ; His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, Require, Prohibit and Command, That no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever (except the Master General, Lieutenant General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid 29th Day of this Inftant April, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coaltwife, any Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaftwife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and suffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Twenty Ninth Year of His late Majefty's Reign, entituled, "An Act to impower His Majefty to pro-" hibit the Exportation of Salt Petre, and to enforce " the Law for impowering His Majefty to prohibit " the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of " Arms and Ammunition ; and also to impower His " Majefty to restrain the carrying Coastwife of Salt " Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammu-" nition." And the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commiffioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, and His Majefly's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

HEREAS His Majefty was gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Second Day of February laft, to Promife and Declare (amongft other Things) That the Boun-

Three Pounds for every Ordinary Seaman, should be paid to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who should, on or before the Thirty. first Day of March last, enter themselves to ferve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board such Tenders as should be en. ployed for Raifing Men for the Service of the Roya! Navy ; and that a Bounty of Thirty Shillings should be paid to every Able bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty five, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who should, on or before the faid Thirty-first Day of March last, in like Manner, voluntarily enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy; and that a Reward of Five Pounds for every Able, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, should be paid to any Perfon, who should difcover any Seaman or Seamen who should fecret themfelves, fo that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's faid Service-And whereas the Time limited for paying the faid Bounties and Rewards expired on the Thirtyfirst of March last; and it being judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, that the fame should be continued to be paid from the faid 31st of March, to the 31st of May next; and that fome Alterations should be made in the Manner of Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards-His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy-Council, doth therefore Order; and it is hereby accordingly ordered, That the aforementioned Bounties of Six Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Three Pounds for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who shall, on or before the 31ft Day of May next, voluntarily enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefty's Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board fuch Tenders as shall be employed for Raising Men for the Service of His Majelty's Navy; And alfo, that the Bounty of Thirty Shillings be continued to be paid to every Able-bodied Landman not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who shall, on or before the faid 31st Day of May next, voluntarily enter themfelves in like Manner to ferve in His Majesty's Royal Navy; And that fuch respective Sums be paid to all fuch Seamen and Landmen immediately upon their Entring, by the Officers, employed in Raifing Men for His Majefty's Fleet, with whom fuch Seamen and Landmen shall respectively enter ; and where there is not any Regulating Officer, by the Clerk of the Cheque or Naval Officer of any of His Majefty's Dock-yards-And His Majefty doth hereby further Order, That the aforementioned Rewards of Five Pounds for every Able, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every
