#### GOD Save the KING.

Prince Radzivil, Great Ge-Warfaw, May 29. neral of Lithuania, died last Week.

Sixteen Thousand Russians, under the Command of M. Czernichew, are in full March for Silefia, where they are to act under the King of Pruffia's Orders.

Venice, June 2. On the 24th past, the Death of the Doge was published by the Ringing of Bell. in this City, and his Figure in Wax was laid in State in the Ducal Palace, the Corpfe having been in-rerred privately on the 20th, in the Vault of the Lauzedano Family, in the Church of the Domini-On the 27th his Obsequies were performed cans. according to Cuilom, by folemn Processions of the Monks and Fryars, fecular Clergy, and religious Fraternities; and the Figure reprefenting the Corpfe was followed by the Relations, in the deepest Mourning, to the Church of the Dominican Fryars, and there reposed in a great Mausolæum erected and il-luminated for that Purpose. The Patriarch officiated in the Funeral Service, and an Oration was made in Latin in Praise of the deceased Prince.

On the 31ft paft, Procuratore Marco Foscarini was elected Doge in the Form established by the Laws of this Republick ; and the publick Feftivals are held for three Days, as usual on that Occasion.

The Duke of Wurtenberg, who has been here fome Time incognito, has declared himfelf, and is received with the Honours shewn by this Republick to Sovereign Princes.

Copenhagen, June 5. The 2d Instant, about Eight o'Clock in the Morning, his Danish Majesty fet out from hence on his Progress, and was attended only by the Ministers of the Privy Council, the Grand Marfhal, and five or fix other Perfons of Diffinction. The next Morning, in about two Hours Time, he happily patied the Great Belt. He is expected at Genorp on the 7th in the Evening, and to continue there till the 11th.

Brunfwick, June 8. Letters from Stettin mention, that the Prince of Bevern had collected all the Troops that could be fpared from thence, and was marched to join the King of Pruffia in Silefia. The Peace with the Swedes was to be declared last Sunday at Magdeburg, without any Ceremony whatever.

Cologne, May 9. The Prince of Condé is expected here the 11th, and will fet out the next Day for the Army.

Juliers, June 10. The French are forming a very great Magazine of Hay, Oats, Straw, Flour, Rye, Rice, &c. at Dalen, between this Town and Ruremond : All the Provisions that were fent from Liege to Urmund, as well as the Forage, &c. that has been furnished by the Dutchy of Juliers, have been carried into this Magazine ; and it is faid it will foon be fo much encreased, that it will be sufficient to subfiit the Army feveral Weeks, flouid they be obliged to quit the Banks of the Rhine and retire towards the Maele.

The Gendarmerie, that were Li. ze, June 11. quartered here, at Vifet and in the Neighbourhood, are all marched by Honry Chapelle and Aix to join the Army on the Lower Rhine, and only fmall Detachments of fome Regiments are left in this State.

Hamburg, June 11. We received Advice Yester-day, that the King of Prussia is encamped with feven Battalions only, at Three German Miles Diltance from the Audrich Army, and Five from Breflaw. General Czernichew's Corps of Troops, confifting

of fixteen Thousand Mon, is expected to join, the 15th Inflant, his Prufitan Majefty's Army in Silefia.

The Pruffian Royal Family; and the Ministry, who have refided at Magdebourg, are expected back at Berlin the 20th Inftant.

Hague, June 11. The News of the Spaniards having taken Poffeffion of the Caftle of Braganza, is confirmed by the Letters from Madrid of the 22d pail, and that they intended next to lay fiege to. Almeyda and Chiaves.

It feems fill uncertain when the Campaign will open on this Side. It is faid, that the Armies cannot begin their Operations for Want of Green Fotage. The Lower Rhine Army was still encamped, in three feparate Corps, at Duffeldorff, Welel, and Rees.

The Prussians continued in the same Position in Saxony, where Marshal Serbelloni had received fome Reinforcements, to enable him to flop the Progret's of Prince Henry.
