A<sup>T</sup> the Court at St. James's, the 28th of May, 1762,

PRESENT,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS His Majefty was pleafed by His Order in Council of the 2d of April laft, to direct, That the Bounties of Six Pounds for every able Seaman, and of Three Pounds for every ordinary Seaman, should continue to be paid to every fuch able and ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who should, on or before the 31st Day of this Inftant, voluntarily enter themselves to serve in His Ma. jesty's Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board fuch Tenders as fhould be employed for raifing Men for the Service of His Majetty's Royal Navy : And alfo that the Bounty of Thirty Shillings fhould be continued to be paid to every able bodied Landman not above the Age of Thirty Five, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who should, on or before the faid 31st Day of this Instant, volunta-rily enter themselves in like Manner to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy; and that a Reward of Five Pounds for every able, and of Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every ordinary Seaman, fhould con-tinue to be paid to any Perfon who fhould difcover any Seaman or Seamen who may fecret themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majefty's faid Service, on or before the faid Thirty-first Day of this Instant. — And whereas the Time limited for paying the faid Bounties and Rewards is near expiring; And it being judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, that the fame should be continued for fome Time longer; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council. doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards, be prolonged and extended from the faid 31ft Day of this Inftant May, to the 31ft Day of July next. And that the faid Bounties and Rewards be paid in the Manner directed by His Majesty's aforementioned Order in Council of the 2d of April last. Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

Breflau, June 6. The King of Pruffia fill continues at Bettlern; and Marshal Daun has yet made no Movement. There are daily Skirmishes between 'the Light Troops on both Sides, but of little Importance. Lieutenant General Verner, who continues in the Higher Silesia, has been in the County of Tetschen, and is returned again to Ratibor.

Brunfwick, June 8. According to Advices received here Yefterday from Prince Henry's Camp in Saxony, dated the 4th, the Pruflian advanced Pofts had been attacked on the 2d, all at the fame Time, by the Auffrian Army, which had been reinforced the Day before, by Seven Battalions. Prince Henry had fucceeded in repulfing the Auftrians every where, with the fmall Lofs of 200 Men.

Hamburgh, June 15. The 12th Inflant, his Swedifh Majefly's Ratification of the Treaty of Peace concluded here the 22d paft, arrived by a Courier to M. Zoge de Manteuffel, Minifter from that Court in this Refidence; and the Day following the Exchange was made, at M. Manteuffel's Houle, with M. de Hecht, the Prufinan Minifter. The fame Day Te Deum was fung at the French Reformed Chapel, which is at M. de Hecht's Hotel, upon the King of Prufila's Peace with the Emperor of Ruffla, and the King of Sweden, at which were prefent, their refpective. Minifters: And in the Evening the Prufilan Minifter gave an Entertainment to both thefe Gentlemen.

The King of Denmark is ill of a Fever and . Cough at Slefwick, which will retard the Review of the Cavalry, which his Majefty had fixed for the 18th Inftant, upon the Heath of Pinneberg, at a German Mile Diftance from Hamburgh.
