AT the Court at St. James's, the 28th of May, 1762,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 2d of April last, to direct, That the Bounties of Six Pounds for every able Seaman, and of Three Pounds for every ordinary Seaman, should continue to be paid to every such able and ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who should, on or before the 31st Day of this Instant, voluntarily enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships; or the Chief Officers on Board such Tenders as should be employed for raising Men for the Service of His Majesty's Royal Navy: And also that the Bounty of Thirty Shillings should be continued to be paid to every able bodied Landman not above the Age of Thirty Five, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who should, on or before the said 31st Day of this Instant, voluntarily enter themselves in like Manner to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy; and that a Reward of Five Pounds for every able, and of Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every ordinary Seaman, should continue to be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who may secret themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's said Service, on or before the said Thirty-first Day of this Instant. — And whereas the Time limited for paying the said Bounties and Rewards is near expiring; And it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the same should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the said Bounties and Rewards, be prolonged and extended from the said 31st Day of this Instant May, to the 31st Day of July next. And that the said Bounties and Rewards be paid in the Manner directed by His Majesty's aforementioned Order in Council of the 2d of April last. Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

Hambourg, June 29. Yesterday the King of Denmark reviewed six Regiments of Horse near Pinneberg; and To-day there has likewise been a like Number. To-morrow his Majesty sets out for Travendahl, in order to pass in Review the Infantry which is encamped between that Place and Segeberg.

The Reigning Duke of Mecklenbourg Schwerin arrived here Yesterday from Lubeck.

We learn from Silesia, that Major General Grant, Commandant of Neifs, has succeeded in an Enterprize against an Austrian Corps commanded by M. de Draskowitz near Ottmachau, in which General Draskowitz, with Seventeen other Officers, and Four Hundred Men, have been made Prisoners of War.

We have Advice, that General Brand, who commands the Van Guard of the Russian Army, was already arrived at Anclam the 20th Instant.

Hague, July 2. The Hereditary Prince was encamped at Werberen on the 29th; and the Prince of Condé at Halteren; when nothing had passed between the two Armies, except Skirmishes.

The Corps under Prince Xavier of Saxony, which was encamped near Dransfeld, in the Hanoverian Territory, the Day of the Action near Wilhelmstahl, has since retired over the Werra, to join the main Army of France; but, in the Retreat, lost its Hospital, Baggage, and Medicines, with the Escort that was conducting them. The Two French Marshals had crossed the Fulda with their Army, and encamp between Cassel and Lutterberg; Lieutenant General Stainville was left with 16 Battalions upon the Kratzenberg. Prince Ferdinand's Head Quarters were at Wilhelmstahl.

There is nothing from Silesia, except that the Austrian General Draskowitz had been made Prisoner near Ottmachau, with several Officers, and 400 Men.

The Hermione, a Spanish Register Ship, which left Lima the 6th of January, bound for Cadiz, was taken the 21st of May off Cape St. Vincent, by three English Frigates, and carried into Gibraltar. Her Cargo is said to consist of near 12 Millions of Money registered, and the unregistered to be likewise very considerable, besides 2000 Serons of Cocoa, and a great Deal of other valuable Merchandize.
