RESENT,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS His Majefty was pleafed by His Order in Council of the 2d of April last, to direct, That the Bounties of Six Pounds for every able Seaman, and of Three Pounds for every ordi-nary Seaman, should continue to be paid to every fuch able and ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who should, on or before the 31st Day of this Inftant, voluntarily enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefty's Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board fuch Tenders as should be employed for raifing Men for the Service of His Majesty's Royal Navy : And also that the Bounty of Thirty Shillings fhould be continued to be paid to every able bodied Landman not above the Age of Thirty Five, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who should, on or before the faid 31st Day of this Instant, voluntarily enter themfelves in like Manner to ferve in His Majesty's Royal Navy; and that a Reward of Five Pounds for every able, and of Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every ordinary Seaman, should continue to be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who may secret themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's faid Service, on or before the faid Thirty-first Day of this Instant. — And whereas the Time limited for paying the faid Bounties and Rewards is near expiring; And it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the fame should be continued for some Time longer; His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards, be prolonged and extended from the faid 31st Day of this Inftant May, to the 31ft Day of July next. And that the faid Bounties and Rewards be paid in the Manner directed by His Majesty's afore-mentioned Order in Council of the zd of April last. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

Advices which have been received from the Provinces, from the 5th Inflant to this Day.

BEIRA.

By a Letter of this Date, Almeida, June 12. we are informed, that the Enemy, to the Number of Eight Thousand Men, has entered the Frontier, and is encamped between Val dela Mulla and Val de Coelha, a League from Almeida : That feveral Parties had fallied forth from the Camp, and had pillaged the Villages upon that Frontier, and had not even spared the Churches ; but that these Parties had been driven back by the Portuguese Militia, who had killed and taken Prisoners upwards of

Two Hundred Spaniards; and that there was great ? and frequent Defertion from this Corps.

From the same Place we have Advices, of the 18th of this Month, that the Spaniards then remained in the fame Camp, without any other News, than that they continued to fend out Parties to guard the Cattle, which they could find difperfed about the Fields.

MINHO.

Amarante, June 20. The Advices received from the Brovince of Tras-os-Montes arc, That the Spanish Army in this Province is divided into three Corps : The principal Body is encamped at Duas Igrejias, near Miranda; another of Five Thousand Men at Torre de Moncorvo; and a Third of the fame Number of Troops near Chaves.

Those who retired from Villa Real and Mirandela towards Miranda, were attacked upon their March by the Militia, which were posted at the Villa pouca de Aguiar, who killed fome of the Spaniards, and took Twenty odd Prifoners, which were fent to the Head Quarters.

We have Advice of the 22d, that a Convoy of Sixty Mules, laden with Provisions, had been taken

from the Enemy about two Leagues from Chaves. The fame Advices add, That the Spaniards are preparing to invade this Province in different Places.

From the Frontier of this Province we have received no Advices worthy of Notice.

ALGARVE.

Tavira, June 12, and 17. Some Boxes of Pa-pers have been thrown upon the Shore near Faro and Alvor; by which it appears, that they came out of a Spanish Frigate called the Hermione, which had failed from Calhao de Lima, in the Month of January of this prefent Year, with Two Millions Six Hundred Thousand Hard Dollars, registered for the Court of Madrid; and although hitherto no Letters have been received from Gibraltar, by which we can be determined, it is here looked upon as probable, that this Register Frigate has been taken by two English ones, which were cruizing upon that Coast.
