## From Queldap July 27, to Saturday July 31, 1762:

PRESENT.

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His der in Council of the 2d of April last, to direct, 't nat the Bounties of Six Pounds for every able Seaman, and of Three Pounds for every ordinary Seaman, should continue to be paid to every fuch able and ordinary Scaman, not above the Age of Fif,, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who that on or before the 3nt Day of May latt, volume any enter themselves to serve in His Maje ty's Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majett,'s Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board such Tenders as should be employed for raising Men for the Service of His Majesty's Royal Navy: And also that the Bounty of Thirty Shillings should be continued to be paid to every able bodied Landman not above the Age of Thirty Five, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who should, on o: Lefore tie faid gift Day of May last, voluntaray ester themselves in like Manner to serve in His Majoury - Loyal Navy; and that a Reward of Five Pounds for every able, and of Two Pounds Ten Sharens for every ordinary Seaman, should continue to be paid to any be fon who should discover any Seiman or Seamen who may fecret themfelves, to that fu is Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majorry's faid Service, on or before the hid Thirty-first Day of May last. —— And twice his the Time limited for paying the faid Bounties the Rewards hath been continued and extended the 31st of this Instant July; And it being judg de Apedient for His Majetty's Service, true the fame thould be continued for fome I ime Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Sounties and Rewards, be prole get and extended from the faid 31st Day of the fait and the fait an this Infranc july, to the 30th Day of September next. And that the faid Bounties and Rewards be paid in the Manner directed by His Majesty's afore-mentioned Order in council of the 2d of April last Whereof all Perions concerned are to take Notice, and govern memfelves accordingly.

Brestaw, July 11. General Ziethen, on the 7th in the Morning, perceiving Marshal Daun had in the Night quitted the strong Camp of Kuntzendorff immediately took Possession of the same. The Marshal has made a Movement with his Lest Wing towards the Konisberg, but his Right is still posted near Schweidnitz i to that his Communication with that Fortress is open; and, by his present Politicas he covers the County of Glatz, where his principal Magazines are. The King of Prussa is encamped between Gottesberg and Seifersdorff, having the Village of Ditmansdorff between him and the Enemy. His Head Quarter is at Seitendorff. Lieutenant General Neuweidt, whom his Prussian Majesty had detached towards Friedland, fell in, on his March, with the Rear of General Brentano's Corps, which he attacked, and made about Four Hundred Prisoners. We hear that General Neuweidt has putfued his March towards Braunau in Bohemia. Body of Light Troops, composed of Cossacks, Hulfars, &c. have penetrated into that Kingdom on the Side of Trautenau. Lieutenant General Neuweidt, on the 5th or 6th Instant, made an Attack on the Austrian Post of Engelsberg, from which he was re-pulsed, with the Lois of upwards of Five Hundred Men. The Cannonade lasted from Three o'Clock till past Eight in the Morning. His Prussian Ma-jesty was present, and much exposed foring the whole Attack.

Hamburgh, July 16. The King of Denmark fet out the Day before Yesterday from Travendahl, on

his Return to Copenhagen.

The Danish Troops, who are entered into the Dutchy of Mecklenburgh, are faid to occupy Scheverin and Domitz.
