 twnce.es the Time timisẹd for paying the faid Bounte: … 'Sevaris hath been continued and extencied : ine 3 If of this Initunt July; And it being juck 1 apeditiat for His Jijecty's Service, $t$ a: the fane thouli be cortinaed for fome lime Inager; His Majetty, wia the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Paym ne of th. hid Bounties and Rewards, be proIc $g^{\prime}$ i and c-aended wom the faid 3 if Day of this lutiont, $\ldots$, , to the zoth Day of September next. Brefrav, futy 11. Gerieral Ziethen, on the 7th in the Mornizg, perceiving Marfhal Daun had for the Night quitted the frong Camp of Kuntzendopf immediately took poffeftion of the fame. The Mar hal has made a Movement wi:h his Left Wing towards the Konisberg, but his Right is ftull pofted near Schweidnitz ifo that his Comrunication with that Fortrefs is open ; and, by his prefent, Poftion be covers the County of Glatz, where his principal Magazines are. The King of Prufia is encamped between Gotesberg and Seiferforff, having the Village of Ditmansdorff between him and the Enemy: His Head Quarter is at Seitendorff. Lieutenant Genetal Neuweidt, whom his Pruffian Majelty bad detached rowards Friedland, fell in', or his March with the Rear of Genetal Brëntano's Corps, which he attacked, and made about Four Hundred Pri4 foners. We hear that General Neuweidt has put= Fusd tis March towards Braunau in Bohemia. A Body of Light Troops, compoled of Coflacks, Hulfars, \&c. have penetrated into that Kingdoin on the Side of Trautenau. Lieutenant General Neuweidt, on the 5 th or 6th Inftant, made an Atcack on the Aufrian Poft of Engelsbetg, from which he was repulfed, with the Liofs of upwards of Five Hundred Men. The Canaonade lated from Thriee o'Clodit zill pafu Eight in the Morning. His Pruffian Ma' jefty was prefent, and much expored Goring the whole Attack.
