'in the mean While, with the greatest Rapidity, behind the French Army, and was already in Possefion, on the 7th Instant, of Muhlhausen, Eschwege, and Wanfried: By this Means, the Enemy was watched on all Sides, though they have fince made a little Opening to their Communication, by forcing our Pofts at Ulrichstein, Pattenberg, and Francken-berg, by the Prince of Condé ; and of Friedewalde by General Stainville. The Prince of Condé, by the last Advices, was still at Grunberg. He had endeavoured to force the Post of Hombourg upon the Ohme, in which he failed; as he likewife did in an Attempt upon the Left of the Hereditary Prince's Corps at Ramrot, on the 9th, at that Time commanded by Lieutenant General Hardenberg. The Hereditary Prince is fince returned to his Corps from the main Army, and intended to march forward on the 13th Inftant.

It is faid, that the Trenches were opened before Almeyda on the 25th of July; and the Letters add, that the Spanish Troops are in great Want of Quarters of Refreshment.

Admiralty Office, August 24. His Majesty's Ship Liverpool, commanded by Captain Richard Knight, failed the 27th of last Month from Plymouth on a Cruife; and the fame Day fell in with and took Le Jacques, a French Privateer, of two Carriage and eight Swivel Guns, with Forty-one Men, from Roscow. And on the 18th Instant, in the Latitude 49. 35. Capt. Knight retook the Two Brothers, bound from Carolina for London with Rice.
