Milen, Sept. 4. Everal new Regiments are at present raising in this Dutchy, and, among others, the Count de Bolognetti does levy a Régiment for the fervice of Sicily; feyeral Troops have already been transported thither from hence this Summer, and more we intended. We had expected to have heard, ere this, of the formal besieging of Meffins, by the Viceroy of Sicily; but, it seems, the arrival of the Dutch Fleet under the command of Lieutenant-Admiral de Ruyter, as well as of Don Juan of Austria, is first expected.

Venice, Scpt. 7. By a Bark which arrived here on Saturday laft, we have advice, That the Baffa of Boffina had received new orders from the Grand Signior to gather together what Forces he pollibly could and to caufe them to march towards Poland, being refolved to profecute the War with all imaginable vigor against that Crown. Signior Antonio Barbaro prepares for his journey to Rome, whither hegoes to relide in quality of Extraordinary Ambaffador on the part of this Republick. From Palermo in Sicily we have advice, That the French have taken Augusta, feirinate between Catanos, and Syracuja, fo that they are now near Neighbors to those two places : It's faid the taking of Augusta was the lefs difficult to the French, for that they had an intelligence within the Town; however, that the Inhabitants defended it fix Great preparations are making for the publick hours. entry of Signior Giuftiniani, the new Procurator of St. Mark. On Tuesday last, the Deputies of Bergamo were to complement our Doge in the ufual m maor. Swerin, Sept. 11. To morrow, or the day following, will be held the Conference, fo often spoken of; between the King of Denmark and the Elector of Brandenburgh, at Gadel ufeb, a Town belonging to the Duke of Meck-lenburg our Prince. The Danish Army which has its Rendezvous at Mullem, is composed of 18000 Men.

The Elector of Brandenburgh continues with his Forces encamped at Swin, and the Imperial Troops, commanded by General Cops, at Gustraw. Wissur, Sept. 12. Colonel Wangelin who was taken by the Brandenburghs at Ratenuw, is at liberty again, having been exchanged for Major-General Goize, and roo common Soldiers. The faid Colonel has orders to

raife a new Regiment of Dragoons. Vienas, sept. 8. Here is arrived an Envoy from the Prince of Tranfilvania, to intercede with his Imperial Majefly infavor of fome of the Rebels of Hungary; the Emperor having given Count Spaar's Regiment to the eldelt fin of the Duke of Brunfwick Wolfenbuttel, he is preparing to match with it towards the Upper Auffria, and his order to recluit it to 2500 men, as all the other Imperial Regiments are this Imperial Majefly has nominated the Count de Caprara, Coufin to the Count of that name, who is at prefent in the Imperial Army, to go to the Prince of Orang t, and to continue in his Camp for the reft of the Campagne. continue to commit frequent diforders in the Countrey.

Hamburgh, Sept. 15. We are now affured, That the Duke of Hanouer hach made a Treaty with the Confederates, by which he obliges himfelf not to affift the Suedes; and accordingly, it's faid, that he has drawn his Troops out of Ferden. So foon as the Conference is over between the king of Dinmark and the Elector of Brandenburgh, the Armies will begin to act, pursuant to the Refolutions that will be there taken ; the general opinion is, That the King of Denmark will fall into the Dutchy of Bremen. Since the return of our Deputies from Mullem, we are much more at eafe here ; for we understand that they were very kindly received and difmiffed by the King of Denmark, and the Prefents they made his Majefty accepted. The Queen of Denmark is at prefent at Gluckfladt, where the will continue, till his Majesties return. We have not as yet any advice of the Suediff Fleet being at Sea, nor of any thing that hath , been attempted by that of Denmark, which continues to Cruife on the Coafts of Pomeren. From Macgdeburg they write, That Colonel Smith, late Governor of that place, who had been taken into Arreft by order of his Electoral Highnels, on Difpition of holding intelligence with the Enenty, and had made his escape, hath been re-taken, as he was travelling within two Leagues of Ber-lin. The Troops of the Bishop of Munifer are advanced within a League of Ferden.

Stratturgh, Sept. 13. The ninth inflant, the Imperial-Army decamped from Dachiffeis, and marched to Hochf. Iden; where it continued the two following dayss , by reason of the great rains that fell. General Monterucyli, fraving there advice, That a party of 400 French Horfe. was abroad to observe his march, sent out Major-Gengral schultz with 800 Horfe, who fell upon the French near Ober-Ehenheim, and totally routed them, greatelt part of them being killed upon the place, and 40 made. Prisoners, and among them ten Officers. The 14, the Impetialists decamped from Hochfeld, and marched directly towards Save ne, which the Prince of Baden inveffed yefterday morning early; it is faid that there are 2000 French in Garifon, and that the Governor is refolved to defend the place to the laft. The Brandenburgh Troops which have had their quarters in the Diocefs of Colagne, conrinue Aill in the Neighborhood of Minden, together with the Munfter Troops ; it's faid, they will march to mo. fow or next day. We are told that the City of Bremen hath quieted its Neutrality, in obedience to the Empetors Mandate, who will not permit that any Prince or State of the Empire shall observe any Neutrality with the Encines thereof: and it's faid, that the Duke of Hannuer has likewife declared for the Confederates,
