Combustion, one of the Nuntios of the Court Party made a Manifest for the breaking up of the Diet, which occasioned a second Adjournment; and is that Nuntio does not withdraw the Manifest, the Diet must be accordingly at an End, after fetting two Days only.

Brunfwick, Ostober 19. Advices from Munden, of the 16th, give us the pleafing Account, that, on the preceding Day, the Hereditary Prince (in the Opinion of the Surgeon who attended him) was quite free from a Fever, and the Wound in a Way to be healed in three or four Weeks Time. Doctor Worloff, who had been fent for from Hanover, had quitted the Prince; and the Duke of Brunfwick returned hither Yesterday.
