In Saxony the Aultrians have have again -attempted to difodge Prince Henry of Pruffia the 14th; but His Royal Highnefs had the good Fortune to repulfe them, and fill maintained the Pofl of Freyberg. The King of Prufia had detached 10,000 Men to reinforce his Brother, under General Neuwied, who was already in Lufatia, on his Way torsaxony. The Hereditary Prince continues to mend daily: His Serene Highnefs fits up every Day feveral Hours
Hague, Oztober 29. General Dieffach, the Commandant of Caffely made a Sally on the $22 d$ Intant, at the Head of the whole Garrion, and obliged the Ordinary Guard to abandon the Trenches; but Prisce Frederick of Branfwick, at the Head of Four Betritions, coming quickly to their Support, drove she Eneny back into Caffel with great Lots, before they Lad Time to do any Damage to the Works.
