**W** Ratifon, November 29. We hear that the Prussians have entered Windsheim an Imperial City, and were marched to Rotenbourg on the Tauber, and from thence towards the Duke of Wurtemberg's Country. Another Corps was at Dirschingen, belonging to the Prince of Tour Taxis, Three German Miles from Nordlingen.

*Copenhagen, November 30.* The King of Denmark, together with all the Royal Family, is now settled in Town for the Winter. Sunday the 28th Instant, being the Queen Dowager's Birth-day, that Festivity was celebrated here Yesterday with the usual Splendor; the Evening having concluded with a very elegant Supper, and a Ball at Court.

*Berlin, December 4.* The King of Prussia, accompanied with Lieutenant General Seydlitz, has been visiting the Cordon of his Troops in Saxony, and will arrive at Leipzig as this Day or To-morrow.

*Hague, December 10.* We hear that a Body of Hessian Troops was to occupy Cassel the 8th Instant; and that another Corps was in March to take Possession of Ziegenhayn and Marburg; both which Places the French were preparing to evacuate.
