7 H I S Day His Majesty came to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes feated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, Sir Septimus Robinson, Knt. Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Message from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Assent to,

An Act for granting an Aid to His Majesty by a Lana Tax to be raised in Great Britain, for the Sorvice of the Year, One thousand seven hundred and fixty-three.

An Act for continuing and granting to His Majesty, ertain Duties upon Malt. Mum, Cyder, and Perry. for the Service of the Year, One thousand seven bundred

An Act to continue and render more effectual two Acts of Parliament, for Repairing and Widening the Road leading from the Black Bull Inn in Dunstable in the County of Bedford, to the Way turning out of the faid and up to Shafford House in the County of Hertford.

An Act to continue and render more effectual two Acts of Parliament for Repairing the Roads from Lemfford Mill through Welveyn and Stevenage, and by Cory's Mill to Hitchin, and from Welwyn through Codicot to Hitchin in the County of Hertford.

And to Five private Bills.

Genoa, November 27. The greatest Part of the Nobility of this State being returned to Town from the Villegiature, on the 24th Inflant a small Council was fummoned, in which they reduced the Number of Candidates to fix, for the Dignity of Doge: The next Day the Grand Council mer, and, by a Plurality of Votes, elected his Excellency Ralph Brignole into that High Office. As foon as the Election was over, he was complimented by great Part of the Nobility; and Yesterday as usual received the Compliments of the Foreign Ministers and Confuls on the fame Occasion.

On the 21st Instant in the Morning, four Backs sailed from hence with about thirteen Hundred Men for Bastia in Corlica, in which Number are included five Companies of new raised Men, called Free Companies, who are to serve only three Years.

Whireas it has been humbly represented to the King, that Mr. William Cheyney, an Inhabitant of the Tonin of Hungerford, in the County of Berks, upwards of Sewenty Years of sign, and his Wife, were, on Saturday the 11th Infant, Litauen Sewen and Eight o'Clock in the Evening, (as is collected from Circumstances) acten their Maid, on only Servent, was at a Neighbour's House, murdered in their own Dwelling House in the Town of Hargerford oferefuld: The faid William Cheyney bawing been found, the next Morning, fitting in an Arm-Chair, in the Parlier, with his read reclined, and dead, with a large Wound on the back Part of his H. ad, which fremed to have been made with on Ax, Chaver, or some such Instrument, and his faid Wife lying on the Floor, groweling in her Blood, with a large Fracture in her Skull, which was much depressed upon the Brain, a little above the Temple, and who bad her Nefe alm st ceft off, and her Face mangled in a most ghastly Manuer, of which Wounds she died the next Day, being the 13th, in the Asternoon: That, in the seweral Rooms of the faith House, every Thing was found in Consustant Bureau, Drawers, &c. econes, and what was in them scattered about, though it did not appear that any Thing, except Money, (the Quantity of awhich awas not known) and two Watches, one of Gold, the other of Silver, had been taken away; the Latter of which Watches had This remarkable in it, that it showed, on the Dial Plate, the Day of the Month: His Migely, for the letter discouring and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said botted and barbarous Muraers, and in the said Robbery, is, hereby, fleafed to promise His mift gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person, or Person, who actually committed both, or either of the faid Murders) who shall discover his, or her, Accomplice, or Accomplices, in the said Crimes, so that he, she, or they, may be apprehended and conviced thereof.
