Lisbon, December 28.

Captain Graves, in His Britannick Majesty's Ship the Antelope, in his Passage from Newfoundland, with the Fish Ships under his Convoy, met with the Marlborough Man of War Captain Burnet, which in her Voyage from the Havannah had sprung a Leak; and the Ship's Company, who had been for several Days in very great Distress, were obliged to leave her, and to go on board the Antelope, which arrived Yesterday in this Harbour.

His most Serene Highness Prince Charles of Mecklenbourg took his Leave of the King and Queen of Portugal, and all the Royal Family, on Sunday; and Yesterday the Count de Oeyras waited upon his Highness, and presented him, from the King of Portugal, with his Majesty's Picture very richly set with Diamonds. His most Serene Highness is preparing to embark in a few Days on board the Venus for England.

Rees, January 6. It having been resolved to demolish the Fortifications, that were raised for the Security of this Post, a Number of Peasants have been working at it for some Days past, and the Workmen were considerably augmented Yesterday.

Dusseldorf, January 7. The Prussian Troops about Wesel are much augmented; near 4000 of them are very near that Place.

Cologne, January 7. The 5th Instant, at Four in the Evening, 1600 Prussian Troops took Possession of Keyserwerth; when two Companies belonging to the Elector of Cologne, who were in Garrison there, marched out.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that Richard Preston stands charged, on Oath, with the cruel Murder and Robbery of a young Man in the Month of June 1759, in a Wood at Higney, in the Parish of Ramsey in Huntingdonshire; in order for the apprehending and bringing to Justice the said Richard Preston, His Majesty does hereby grant a Reward of One Hundred Pounds, to any Person or Persons, who shall apprehend, or be the Means of apprehending the said Richard Preston; to be paid by the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, upon the Commitment of him or them Richard Preston, to Prison. The said Preston is a Labourer, aged about 50 Years, about 5 Feet 6 or 7 Inches high, brown Complexion, grey Eyes, a Scar on his upper Lip, and, about a Year ago, wore a brown Coat, and brown Bob Wig. Richard Keen, an Accomplice in the said Murder, is now in Huntingdon Goal.
