Ratisbon, January 10.

THE Elector of Bavaria has ordered all his Troops, except the Guards that remain at Munich, to march to Donawert, and along the Danube. Thirty Pieces of Cannon have been sent to the different Posts.

Frankfort, January 11. The Austrian Regiments in March from Franconia are arrived near this Town, but are ordered to halt till further Orders, which seems to credit the Report of a Peace being negotiating between the Courts of Vienna and Berlin.

Dusseldorff, January 14. A Convention has been made between M. Monteynard and M. Bauer, by which it was stipulated the Prussian Troops should not cross the Roer nor the Rhine; which Convention they say expires the 17th, but it is thought will be further prolonged.

Cologne, January 14. Orders have been sent to raise 1500 Men to augment the Troops of her Imperial Majesty in the Netherlands.

Munster, January 15. The Marquis of Granby is perfectly recovered from his Illness, and is expected here To-morrow in his Way to England.

Hague, January 18. We are in Expectation of receiving, every Day, an Account, that the first Division of the British Troops has begun its March from the Bishoprick of Munster, in order to pass through the Territory of the Republick, on their Way to Willemstadt; where they are to embark.
